#### 2. Implementation of the Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA) - Immediate Actions

SOR

- Strengthen or establish national mechanisms/platforms for disaster risk reduction;
- Develop basic matrix of roles and initiatives against HFA, including partnerships and leading agencies – and strengthen the multi-stakeholders coordination mechanism building on ISDR;
- Develop initial set of benchmarks & indicators against HFA- Governments and local stakeholders;
- Including DRR in national development strategies.


