Activities and results

- The campaign to shift pastoral livestock husbandry to intensified farming husbandry
- The campaign “Virgin Land-III” for supplying population by flour and vegetables.
- Strengthening small and medium size enterprises

Gaps and challenge identified

- Insufficient resources
- Herders adjusted to pastoral livestock husbandry

Plan

- To supply the population domestic flour and vegetables
- To have independent intensified farming husbandry

- Repeater stations installed in urban areas and increased the scope of radio communication.

Gaps and challenge identified

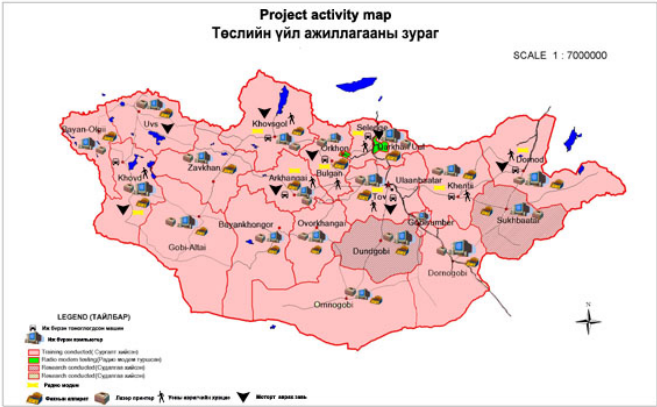
- Insufficient resources

- To introduce the model CBDM to other communities
- To facilitate community-to-community learning

Activities and results

- The establishment of the Forest Agency
- Irrigating agricultural land and providing pasture land with water sources
- Each of 21 aimags have 2-3 points for allocating food, petroleum, hay and fodder

Gaps and challenge identified

- Insufficient resources
- Inconsistent implementation of programs and projects
- Not pursuing standards and codes

- Enforcement standards and codes
- Monitoring program and project implementation
- To reduce the desertification

- Preparedness of techniques and human resource improved
- More than 100 rescuers trained in Russian Federation and Korea, in 2008.
- Legal environment for supplying rescue, fire extinguishing and recovery units with techniques and equipments met international standards created

Gaps and challenge identified

- Insufficient resources
- Instability of qualified personnel

Plan

- To improve professional skill of rescuers
- To update disaster preparedness plan
