

- **(Period)** 2018. 1. ~
- (Organization) Headed by MOIS, All members are under either SFM team or R&D Team(about 30 members)
  - (SFM Team) Manage and submit data for 7 Targets and 38 Indicators (Ministries)
  - > (R&D Team) Advice on customizing SFM methods
    (Research Institutes and Private Experts)
- (Main Roles)
  - Customize Sendai Framework Monitoring methods and analyze global trends
  - Improve existing disaster statistics and develop new statistics/indicators
  - Submit data and country reports for Sendai Framework Monitoring

# 3. Analysis of data availability for SFM

Target	Data Availability	Feasibility for further data
A – Mortality	All	Disaggregation : Age, Income, Disability, etc.
B - Affected People	Most	Disaggregation : Age, Income, Disability, etc. Complicated : Livelihoods
C - Direct Economic Loss	Most	Complicated : productive assets
D - Critical Infrastructure	Few	Complicated : disruption of services, critical infrastructure, health Facilities, etc
E - DRR Strategies	All	
F - International Cooperation	Most	Feasible : OECD DAC CRS
G - Early Warning	Most	Complicated : No. of evacuated People



## 4. Policy Research Project

- (Project Period/Budget) 2018.7.~2019.1.(6 Months) / \$52,000 (Approx.)
- (Main Job)
  - Define key terms such as the scope of disaster
    - Define terms in 'Technical Guidance' provided by UN
    - Customize terms in TC such as Critical Infrastructure, Productive Assets, Basic Services which are explained via sets of examples
  - Improve the existing statistics and develop new statistics
    - Analyze feasibility and level of disaggregation (Ex: Sex, Income, Age, Disability, Administrative Unit, etc.)
    - Develop calculating methods for 12 SF indicators currently not available
    - > Study data collection methods for newly developed indicators
  - Establish Mid-Long term Sendai Framework Implementation Strategies



## 6. Challenges and Opportunities

## Challenges

- SFM contributors have a hard time understanding Sendai Framework and Technical Guidance
- Additional personnel, budget, organization for SFM required
- Challenges for consistent reporting: unavailable past data, change of the scope of disaster statistics, etc.
- Some data are neither final nor official at the time of reporting OECD DAC CRS takes two years to get approved; Demographics, Disaster Statistics takes 6 to 10 months
- Personal Information Protection for disaggregation : Income/Gender/Disability are personal information that requires approval

#### **Opportunities**

- Qualitative and quantitative improvement of domestic disaster statistics
- Provides information for decision on national DRR strategies and targets
