Chronology of Events (Tropical Storm Caloy) May 9, 2006

 $10{:}00~{\rm AM}$ -The active low pressure area located 840 kms east of northern Mindanao developed into a tropical depression (TD) and was named Caloy or internationally known as "Chanchu" .

 $10{:}00~{\rm PM}$ - Intensified into a tropical storm (TS) during the first six (6) hours with maximum center winds of 65 kph.

May 10, 2006

5:00 AM - Maintained its strength as it continued to move west northwest in the general direction of Samar-Bicol area.

 $10{:}00~\rm{AM}$ - Located $~600~\rm{kms}$ southeast of Eastern Samar (8.9 degrees north, 130.7 degrees east) with maximum centers winds of $~65~\rm{kph}$ near the center ~ and gustiness of up to $80~\rm{kph}$

5:00 PM- Intensified further as it continued to move west northwestward threatening Samar-Bicol area. With maximum center winds of 75 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph

10:00 PM- Gained more strength at 85 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 100 kph, as it continued to threaten Eastern Visayas-Bicol Region area

May 11, 2006

• M/T Malitam, a self propelled tanker barge owned by Batangas Bay Carrier Inc (BBCI) loaded with 1.1 M liters of Bunker Fuel Oil (BFO) run aground at the vicinity 200 meters offshore of Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro due to bad weather brought by Typhoon Caloy. The 13 crew members were successfully rescued.

Region V

 \cdot On or about 120400H May 2006, one passenger motorboat marked M/B Mae Ann 5 plying Masbate-Pilar docked at Brgy Kinamaligan, Masbate City with passenger on board pending departure due to Typhoon Caloy.. Said motor boat departed without MOSD (permit) and not allowed because the area is under signal no 2. . Owner violated pertinent rules of PCG

• On or about 121345H May 2006, the M/V Northern Samar a passenger /cargo vessel of 268.87 GT/ 228.73 NT, with 31 crew members on board, owned and operated by Sta Clara Shipping Lines plying Tabaco-Virac Catanduanes route and vice versa, sunk about 50 meters away from the Tabaco Pier while moored at portside at the height of TS Caloy.

•On or about 111615H May 2006, F/B Mark Cris Ra with 33.60 GT.22.88 NT, owned and operated by Rodelo Antileo of Roxas City with five passengers on board capsized while anchored at 150 yards northeast of Botongon Pier, Estancia, Iloilo.

•On or about 121530H May 2006, F/B Fanny A of 13.50 GT/9.07 NT operated and owned by Fanny Celorico with 7 crew on board, capsized while anchored at the vicinity 500 yards off Bayas Island, Estancia, Iloilo All crews were rescued safe and sound except one who suffered slight injuries
