SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 03.07.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many over Kerala and coastal Karnataka; many over interior Karnataka, Konkan & Goa, Orissa and Mizoram; at a few places over Madhya Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal & Sikkim and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and at one or two places over Western Himalayan region, east Rajasthan, Chattisgarh, Bihar, rest northeastern States, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rajalaseema, Tamil Nadu and Lakshadweep. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Maharashtra, coastal & north interior Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Orissa, Chhattisgarh, South Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, Saurashtra and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over north Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim and northeastern states during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Uttarkhand, Himachal Pradesh and north Andhra Pradesh and at one or two places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Rajasthan and rest south peninsular India.
- Maximum temperature would fall by 2-4° C over northwest, east and central India during next 3 days.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

➤ There are 02 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 03.07.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 15 Teams consisting of 514 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –12, Andhra Pradesh – 01 and J&K-02.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Maharashtra, coastal & north interior Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Orissa, Chhattisgarh, South Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, Saurashtra and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over north Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim and northeastern states during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Uttarkhand, Himachal Pradesh and north Andhra Pradesh and at one or two places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Rajasthan and rest south peninsular India.
- Maximum temperature would fall by 2-4° C over northwest, east and central India during next 3 days.

Weather Warning

• Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Konkan & Goa, coastal Karnataka, Telangana, north coastal Andhra Pradesh, south Chhatisgarh and Orissa during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, east and adjoining central India and north-eastern states.
- Increase in rainfall activity over northwest India.

<u>CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)</u>

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 3rd July, 2012, there are 02 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

Assam

- ➤ River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in district Jorhat, Assam is flowing at 85.18 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with falling trend.
- ➤ River Brahamputra at Dhubri in District Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 29.23 m against the danger level of 28.62m with falling trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 3rd July, 2012.

- ❖ In Assam, 09 teams of 1st Bn, NDRF consisting of 314 personnel (Kamrup-18, Tinsukia-71, Sonitpur -182 and Dhemaji-43) and 03 teams of 2nd Bn NDRF consisting of 106 personnel (Barpeta-35, Shivsagar-35 and Nagaon-36) deployed in connection with flood relief and rescue.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In J&K, 02 teams of 7 BN NDRF consisting of 79 personnel deployed in Pahalgam (J&K) for FAMEX & Amarnath Yatra duty.
