Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 04.07.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many over Gujarat region, Saurashtra, Maharashtra, coastal Karnataka, Kerela, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Orissa, West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Lakashadweep, north coastal Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and at one or two places over north Uttar Pradesh, southeast Rajasthan, interior Karnataka, south Tamilnadu, Jharkhand and Bihar. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over West coast, northeastern states, Vidarbha, Orissa, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Gujarat, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during next 24 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.
- Maximum temperature would fall by 2-4° C over northwest, east and central India during next 2 days.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

16 Teams consisting of 555 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –12, Andhra Pradesh – 01, Uttar Pradesh-1 & J&K-02.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over West coast, northeastern states, Vidarbha, Orissa, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Gujarat, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during next 24 hours and increase thereafter.

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.
- Maximum temperature would fall by 2-4° C over northwest, east and central India during next 2 days.

Weather Warning

• Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Konkan & Goa, south Gujarat, Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 48 hours.

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, east and central India and north-eastern states and Uttar Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Punjab, Haryana and east Rajasthan.

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 4th July, 2012, there are 02 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

<u>Assam</u>

- River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in district Jorhat, Assam is flowing at 85.16 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with rising trend.
- River Brahamputra at Dhubri in District Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 28.93 m against the danger level of 28.62 m with falling trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 4th July, 2012.

- In Assam, 09 teams of 1st Bn, NDRF consisting of 314 personnel (Kamrup-18, Tinsukia-71, Sonitpur -182 and Dhemaji-43) and 03 teams of 2nd Bn NDRF consisting of 106 personnel (Barpeta-35, Jorhat -35 and Nagaon-36) deployed in connection with flood relief and rescue.
- In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- In J&K, 02 teams of 7 BN NDRF consisting of 79 personnel deployed in Pahalgam (J&K) for FAMEX & Amarnath Yatra duty.
- In Uttar Pradesh,01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 41 personnel deployed in Modinagar (UP) to check and inspect unidentified chemical substance available in the container and bags near Gang nahar under PS Niwari, Modinagar, distt. Ghaziabad(UP). Neutralisation operation is completed and team reported back to HQr.
