RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat region, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Bengal & Sikkim and Assam; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Konkan, Lakshadweep, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Mizoram, and coastal Karnataka; at one or two places over Punjab, Haryana & Delhi, northwest & east Rajasthan Saurashtra, Goa, Kerala, Tamilnadu, Telangana, Orissa, Nagaland, Tripura, interior Maharashtra and interior Karnataka. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (3 cm and above) recorded at 1730 hrs IST of yesterday were: Hut Bay and Cherrapunji—8 each, Jamshedpur and Behraich-5 each, Santiniketan, Berhampore and pilani-4 each, Jalpaiguri, Siliguri, Balurghat, Jhansi, Mayabandar and Carnicoabar-3 each.

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and northeastern states.

There are 06 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 14.07.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

21 Teams consisting of 743 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –14, Andhra Pradesh – 01, Jharkhand-01, J&K-02 and Bihar-03.

River Kosi at Basua in District Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.85 m against the danger level of 47.75 m with Rising trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 14th July, 2012.

- In Assam, 14 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 389 personnel (Kamrup-23, , Dhemaji-43, Sivasagar-34, Dhubri-65, Sonitput-185 Jorhat-35, Nagaon-35, Barpeta-36) deployed in connection with flood relief/rescue, training and emergency response.
- In Jharkhand, 01 team of 2nd Bn NDRF consisting of 34 personnel deployed at District Deograh for FAMEX and emergency response during Sawan Mela.
- In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- In J&K, 02 teams of 7 BN NDRF consisting of 84 personnel deployed in Pahalgam (J&K) for FAMEX & Amarnath Yatra duty.
- In Bihar 03 teams of 09th Bn NDRF consisting of 115 personnel (Mujjafarpur-42, Supoul- 38 and Gopalganj-35) deployed in connection with prepositioning monsoon.
