Subject:SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORTSUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 15.07.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over Northeastern States, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand and Andaman & Nicobar Islands: at many places over Bihar, east Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Tamilnadu and west coast; at a few places over Western Himalayan region, west Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Delhi, Gujarat, interior Maharashtra, interior Karnataka, Gangetic West Bengal and Orissa and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside west Rajasthan where weather remain mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (4 cm and above) recorded at 0830 hrs IST of today were: Cherrapunji—54, Shillong and Bagdogra-10 each, Gangtok, Passighat, Carnicobar and Panagarh-7 each, Gannavarm-6, Agumbe, Kalimpong, Bara, Ratnagiri, Champa, Dharamapuri and Tadong-5 each and Tiruppattur, Arakkonam, Khajuraho, Datia, Mandla, Jorhat, Berhampore, Shantiniketan, Patna Mahabaleshwar, Parbhani, Hut bay, Tondi, Tezpur and north Lakhimpur- 4 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Orissa, Vidarbha, east Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Tamilnadu and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over western Himalayan region during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Punjab, Haryana & Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan, Gujarat region, west Madhya Pradesh, Marathawada, Madhya Maharashtra and interior Karnataka. and Tamil Nadu.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over west Rajasthan and Saurashtra & Kutch.

There are 01 High flood & 05 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 15.07.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

21 Teams consisting of 743 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –13, Andhra Pradesh – 01, Jharkhand-01, J&K-02 and Bihar-03.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

Weather Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at a few places with isolated extremely heavy falls (>25 cm) over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam and Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 48 hours.
- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Orissa, Chhattisgarh and Andaman & Nicobar Islands during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over northeast & east India and east Uttar Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over central India, west coast & western Himalayan region.

- River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in District Jorhat, Assam is flowing at 85.96m against the danger level of 85.04 m with Rising trend.
- River Brahamputra at Dhubri in District Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 28.77m against the danger level of 28.62m with Steady trend.

<u>Bihar</u>

River Kosi at Basua in District Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 48.00 m against the danger level of 47.75 m with Falling trend.

<u>West Bengal</u>

River Tista at Domohani in District Jalpaiguri, West Bengal is flowing at 86.25 m against the danger level of 85.95 m with Rising trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 15th July, 2012.

- In Jharkhand, 01 team of 2nd Bn NDRF consisting of 34 personnel deployed at District Deograh for FAMEX and emergency response during Sawan Mela.
- In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- In J&K, 02 teams of 7 BN NDRF consisting of 86 personnel deployed in Pahalgam (J&K) for FAMEX & Amarnath Yatra duty.
- In Bihar 03 teams of 09th Bn NDRF consisting of 115 personnel (Mujjafarpur-42, Supoul- 38 and Gopalganj-35) deployed in connection with prepositioning monsoon.
