





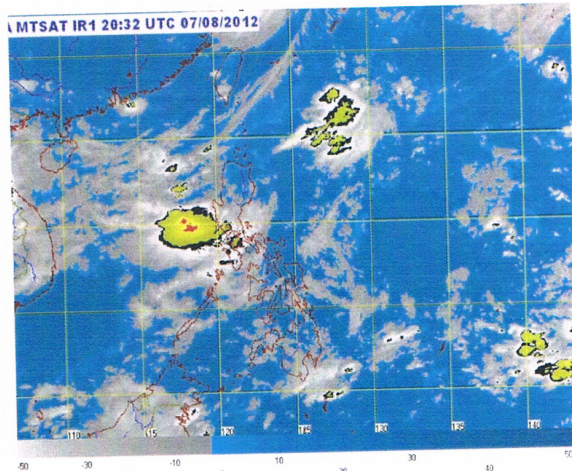

I. WEATHER SITUATION: (As of 11:00 AM, 08 August 2012)

The Southwest Monsoon (HABAGAT) has weakened slightly as Tropical Cyclone "HAIKUI" outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) has moved farther away and made landfall in the vicinity of Shanghai, China early this morning.

Consequently, weather condition is expected to slightly improve further before the weekend because of the weakening of the south westerly winds. However, for the next 12 hours, light to moderate rains (2.5-5mm/hr) in some portions of Batangas are expected. Intermittent moderate to heavy (5-10mm/hr) but less frequent rains compared with the past 24-hours will be experienced in the following Provinces: Portions of Pangasinan, Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, Tarlac, Bulacan, Bataan, Rizal, Cavite and NCR.



Threats of flashfloods and floods in low lying areas and landslides in mountainous areas as well as Lahar flows over Pinatubo will gradually decrease.

Residents living in those areas are still warned against the danger of these hazards that may occur.

II. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. EFFECTS

1. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)

Flooding

- NCR - Six teen (16 cities and 1 municipality); Region I Pangasinan (2 municipalities and 1 city)); Region III Bulacan, Pampanga, Bataan, Tarlac and Zambales (49 municipalities /cities) and Region IV-A _Cavite Laguna, and Rizal (21 municipalities/cities)

Landslide

- As of 07 August 2012, a landslide incident occurred in Bayanihan St, Brgy Commonwealth, Quezon City. Two (2) houses were reportedly buried along with the inhabiting families. A total of nine (9) persons were reported dead and four (4) others were injured. The injured victims were rushed to East Avenue Medical Center. Rescue operations were terminated.

Drowning

- As of 7:00 AM 8 August 2012, a body identified as Roel Fabros was found dead due to drowning in Brgy. Dalandanan, Valenzuela City.

2. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

- Based on the report of DSWD dated **3:00 PM, 08 August 2012**, the total number of population affected in **1,139 Barangays / 106 Municipalities / 26 Cities in 15 Provinces** of Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, VI and NCR is: **265,630 families / 1,220,021 persons**
- Of the above total affected, **80,189 families/ 394,844 persons** are currently served inside and outside evacuation centers

Inside <u>296</u> Evacuation Centers (ECs)	<u>31,403 families / 149,170 persons</u>
Outside ECs (relatives/friends)	<u>48,786 families / 245,674 persons</u>

3. CASUALTIES (TAB C)

- A total of **16 persons were reported dead**: **nine (9)** of whom were victims of a landslide incident in Lower Bayanihan, Brgy Commonwealth, Quezon City and **one (1)** from Valenzuela City due to drowning, **three (3)** were from Pampanga, **one (1)** from Zambales and **two (2)** from Batangas.
- A total of four **(4)** persons were injured, most of whom were victims of the landslide incident in Brgy. Commonwealth, Quezon City.

4. STATUS OF LIFELINES

1. Condition of Roads and Bridges (TAB D)

- As of 10:00 PM, 07 August 2012, a total of **147** roads are not passable to all types of vehicles in **Regions III, IV-A, IV-B, VI, CAR and NCR** due to flooding. No reported damages to bridges.

2. Status of Dams and Waterways (As of 12:00 PM, 08 August 2012)

- Angat and Ipo in Bulacan, La Mesa in Quezon City, Ambulao and Binga in Benguet, San Roque in Pangasinan and Pantabangan in Nueva Ecija have already reached their critical levels; hence, they are closely monitored.

- Water releases from the critical dams is expected to affect the following areas: San Manuel, San Nicolas, Tayug, Sta Maria, Asingan, Villasis, Alcala, Bautista, Rosales and Bayambang in Pangasinan; Ramon in Isabela San Mateo, Rizal; Aurora, Cabanatuan, Luna, Reina Mercedes, Burgos, Naguilian and Gamu; and the low lying areas along Angat river from Norzagaray and Hgonoy;
- All residents living in the areas near the Ipo, Ambuklao, Binga, San Roque and Magat dams are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream and those near the La Mesa dam are advised to be alert for the overflow of water in La Mesa Dam.
- As of 2:20 PM 8 August 2012, the water level of Marikina River is 18 m.**

F. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB E)

- A total of **535** houses were damaged in Regions III, IV-B and VI: **466 totally** and **64 partially** damaged.

III. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

A. CONDUCT OF EMERGENCY CABINET MEETING

- The NDRRMC conducted an Emergency Meeting with His Excellency President Benigno Aquino III at 10:00 AM, 7 August 2012 at the NDRRMC Conference Room, attended by DSWD, DILG, DOST (PAGASA), MMDA, DPWH, DOH, Dep Ed, AFP, PNP, BFP, PCG, other agencies and print/ broadcast media. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities
- The DOST (PAGASA), DSWD, DPWH, MMDA and DOH presented their reports based on their respective mandates
- The President raised some specific issues that need to be addressed by the concerned agencies. Likewise provided general guidance to the response and relief agencies to require the LGUs concerned to go around their respective areas through the Brgy Captains and provide necessary assistance whenever necessary
- President's instructions to the agencies were the following: DSWD to find a place where they can put tents as additional evacuation centers; DOH to initiate the provision of water for those who depend on deep wells and how to address flooding in hospitals; DILG to identify all inundated /flooded Barangays in Marikina City affected by SW Monsoon, require all LGUs to go around their areas through the barangay captains; and check floodings in Tarlac and Northern Luzon (La Union, Pangasinan and Ilocos; DOST to fast track the preparation of hazard map of Luzon. DPWH to study the long term solution for Laguna Lake

B. RELIEF AND RECOVERY OPERATIONS

DSWD

- As of 6:00 AM, 08 August 2012, the estimated cost of relief assistance provided to the disaster victims so far amounted to PhP7,934,820.00 from the combined resources of: LGUs) (PhP3,144,033.00, NGOs PhP 770,000.00 and DSWD) PhP4,050,787.00
- Prepositioned standby funds and relief supplies worth PhP36,555,006.38 in all DSWD-FOs along the SW monsoon –affected areas: Standby Funds (PhP4.42 M) and relief supplies (PhP32.14 M)
- DROMIC is closely coordinating with DSWD-FOs concerned for any significant updates related to SW monsoon

DOH

- DOH-HEMS conducted rapid assessment and reported that East Avenue Medical Center; Health Center of the Philippines; Jose Reyes Memorial Medical, San Lazaro Hospital; San Lorenzo Ruiz Memorial Hospital; and Tondo Medical Center were reported flooded; closely monitors the status of health services, offices and personnel at all levels; strengthen advisory and health promotion campaign on the preventive measures of Leptospirosis case and other food and water borne related diseases; and released assorted drugs and medicines and rubber boots to CHDs.
- CHDs I, III, IV-A,, IV-B, and CAR prepositioned assorted drugs and medicines to the LGUs concerned from August 5-8, 2012

Dep ED

- Reported that 51 schools so far are being utilized as evacuation centers; mobilized teachers to conduct classes in QC; and prepare contingency plan (1-2 hr additional for regular classes) to complete 180 days mandatory or make up classes

DPWH

- Rechanneling /diverting of water ways of the two bridges and filling of embankment over cut –off approach is ongoing, utilizing one (1) unit bulldozer and one (10 unit backhoe, three (30 dump trucks of the local government units and one (1) unit pay loader from private firm

C. SEARCH AND RESCUE (SAR) OPERATIONS

- SAR operations were effected through the concerted efforts of the SAR units of AFP, PCG and PNP and around 5,598 personnel, 51 vehicles and 190 sea crafts were mobilized to various areas in Metro Manila

- PRO 2 deployed 77 SAR personnel with 8 rubber boats headed by PSUPT CALANOGA to MMDA to augment SAR operations.

A. NATIONAL

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** was upgraded from BLUE ALERT to RED ALERT STATUS as of 4:45 AM, 07 August 2012 and is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels.
- Conducted Emergency meeting with the President Benigno Simeon Cojuangco Aquino III and was presided by Sec. Voltaire Gazmin, Chairperson of NDRRMC. It is attended by representatives by the Secretaries from different agencies namely: **PAGASA, DOST, MMDA, DSWD, DILG, DOH, DPWH, DepEd, AFP, PNP and PCG**. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities.
- Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 33 suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in National Capital Region and the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Bulacan, Laguna, Cavite and Rizal today, 07 August 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
