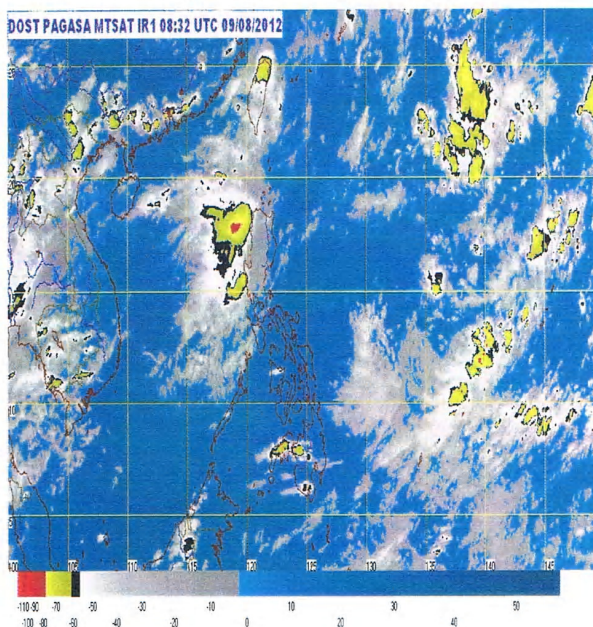

#### **I. WEATHER SITUATION: (As of 5:00 PM, 09 August 2012)**

**SYNOPSIS:** Southwest Monsoon affecting Luzon

**FORECAST:** Northern and Central Luzon and the western section of Southern Luzon will experience occasional rains becoming frequent over the western section of Northern and Central Luzon which may trigger flashfloods and landslides. The rest of the country will be partly cloudy to at times cloudy with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from the Southwest will prevail over Luzon and its coastal waters will be moderate to rough. Elsewhere, winds will be light to moderate coming from the South to Southwest with slight to moderate seas.



#### **II. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

##### **A. EFFECTS**

##### **1. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)**

- A total of 3 incidents were monitored as of 09 August 2012, 6:00AM: One (1) Landslide, one (1) Drowning and one (1) Vehicular accident.

##### **2. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)**

- Based on the report of DSWD as of **3:00 PM, 09 August 2012**, the total number of population affected in **1,611 Barangays / 128 Municipalities / 30 Cities** in **16 Provinces** of Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, VI and NCR is: **460,273 families / 2,110,871 persons**
- Of the above total affected, **119,751 families/ 580,079 persons** are currently served inside and outside evacuation centers

Inside **630** Evacuation Centers (ECs)  
 Outside ECs (relatives/friends)

**66,577 families / 314,795 persons**  
**53,174 families / 265,284 persons**

### 3. CASUALTIES (TAB C)

- A total of **49** persons were reported dead
- A total of four (**4**) persons were injured of whom were victims of the landslide incident in Brgy. Commonwealth, Quezon City.
- A total of three (**6**) persons are still missing while three (**3**) were rescued.

### 4. STATUS OF LIFELINES

#### 1. Condition of Roads and Bridges (TAB D)

- As of 4:00 PM, 09 August 2012, a total of **129** roads and **5** Bridges are not passable to all types of vehicles in **Regions I, II, III, IV-A, VI, CAR and NCR** due to flooding. Most of the reported non-passable ways are from NCR.

- Water releases from the critical dams is expected to affect the following areas: San Manuel, San Nicolas, Tayug, Sta Maria, Asingan, Villasis, Alcala, Bautista, Rosales and Bayambang in Pangasinan; Ramon in Isabelala San Mateo, Rizal; Aurora, Cabanatuan, Luna, Reina Mercedes, Burgos, Naguilian and Gamu; and the low lying areas along Angat river from Norzagaray and Hgonoy;
- All residents living in the areas near the Ipo, Ambuklao, Binga, San Roque and Magat dams are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream and those near the La Mesa dam are advised to be alert for the overflow of water in La Mesa Dam.
- As of 12:00 NN 9 August 2012, the water level of Marikina River has receded down to 17.89m

#### 3. Status of Water and Power Supply (As of 2:00 PM, 09 August 2012)

- Several provinces and cities in NCR and Region III continue to experience water/power outages (TAB J)

## F. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB E)

- A total of 3,116 houses were damaged in Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B and VI: 366 totally and 2,750 partially damaged.

## G. FLOODED AREAS (TAB F)

- A total of 80 Cities/Municipalities from NCR, Regions I, III, and IV-A have severe flooding.

## III. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

### A. CONDUCT OF EMERGENCY CABINET MEETING

- The NDRRMC conducted an Emergency Meeting with His Excellency President Benigno Aquino III at 10:00 AM, 7 August 2012 at the NDRRMC Conference Room, attended by DSWD, DILG, DOST (PAGASA), MMDA, DPWH, DOH, and Dep Ed, AFP, PNP, BFP, PCG, other agencies and print / broadcast media. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities
- The DOST (PAGASA), DSWD, DPWH, MMDA and DOH presented their reports based on their respective mandates
- The President raised some specific issues that need to be addressed by the concerned agencies. Likewise provided general guidance to the response and relief agencies to require the LGUs concerned to go around their respective areas through the Brgy Captains and provide necessary assistance whenever necessary
- President's instructions to the agencies were the following: DSWD to find a place where they can put tents as additional evacuation centers; DOH to initiate the provision of water for those who depend on deep wells and how to address flooding in hospitals; DILG to identify all inundated /flooded Barangays in Marikina City affected by SW Monsoon, require all LGUs to go around their areas through the barangay captains; and check floodings in Tarlac and Northern Luzon ( La Union, Pangasinan and Ilocos; DOST to fast track the preparation of hazard map of Luzon. DPWH to study the long term solution for Laguna Lake
- On 8 August, 2012, His Excellency President Benigno Aquino III, DND Secretary and NDRRMC Chairperson Voltaire Gazmin, MMDA Chairperson Francis Tolentino and Muntinlupa City Mayor Aldrin San Pedro personally inspected the Tunasan Elementary School in Brgy Tunasan, Muntinlupa City to assess the situation of the evacuees.
- The President then proceeded to the NDRRMOC for a short briefing with the NDRRMC TWG and discussed the current weather situation and forecast, roads accessibility and response measures being implemented.

### B. AERIAL SURVEY

- At 8:15 AM 9 August 2012, an aerial survey was conducted by a joint team composed of NDRRMC OPCEN Dir. Edgardo J. Ollet and Mr. Mario Raymundo & Mr. Bernie de Leon of PAGASA. They intended to reach Wawa Dam by following the upstream path of the Marikina River. However, they were forced to turn around when they reached La Mesa Dam due to zero visibility. They again attempted to conduct the survey at around 11:00 AM of the same day and this time was able to penetrate through La Mesa Dam all the way to Montalban when they were again unable to enter the Wawa Dam area due to poor visibility and strong winds.

### C. RELIEF AND RECOVERY OPERATIONS

#### DSWD

- As of 6:00 AM, 08 August 2012, the estimated cost of relief assistance provided to the disaster victims so far amounted to ₱hP7,934,820.00 from the combined resources of: LGUs) (₱hP3,144,033.00, NGOs ₱hP 770,000.00 and DSWD) ₱hP4,050,787.00
- Prepositioned standby funds and relief supplies worth ₱hP36,555,006.38 in all DSWD-FOs along the SW monsoon –affected areas: Standby Funds (₱hP4.42 M) and relief supplies (₱hP32.14 M)
- DROMIC is closely coordinating with DSWD-FOs concerned for any significant updates related to SW monsoon
- **DSWD III** is having difficulty gathering reports from the LGUs due to power outages, especially in some of the municipalities of Bataan.

**DOH HEMS:**

- **DOH-HEMS** conducted rapid assessment and reported that Amang Rodriguez Memorial Medical Center, Dr. Jose Fabella Hospital, Dr. Jose R. Rodriguez Memorial Hospital, Dr. Jose Reyes Memorial Medical Center, East Avenue Medical Center, Research Institute for Tropical Medicines, San Lazaro Hospital, and Tondo Medical Center were flooded but are operational. The emergency room of the San Lorenzo Ruiz Women's Hospital is flooded (knee-deep). Their patients were transferred to the second floor and their generators are not operational due to the flood.
- Closely monitors the status of health services, offices and personnel at all levels; strengthen advisory and health promotion campaign on the preventive measures of Leptospirosis case and other food and water borne related diseases; and released assorted drugs and medicines and rubber boots to CHDs.
- CHDs I, III, IV-A, IV-B, CAR and NCR provided assorted drugs and medicines to the LGUs concerned.
- Raised Code Blue Alert and activated operation center and medical response team on 24 hours duty.

**Dep ED**

- Reported that 51 schools so far are being utilized as evacuation centers; mobilized teachers to conduct classes in QC; and prepare contingency plan (1-2 hr additional for regular classes) to complete 180 days mandatory or make up classes.

**DPWH**

- Rechanneling /diverting of water ways of the two bridges and filling of embankment over cut –off approach is ongoing, utilizing one (1) unit bulldozer and one (10 unit backhoe, three (30 dump trucks of the local government units and one (1) unit pay loader from private firm

**DILG**

- Provided assistance by search and rescue (SAR) and evacuation in the municipalities of Batangas namely: Calaca, Calatagan, Lemery, Lian, Taal, Tuy, Bauan, San Luis, Agoncillo, Alitagtag, Cuenca, Laurel, Malvar, San Nicolas, Sta Teresita, Talisay, Tanauan City
- Provincial Engineering Office mobilized heavy equipment (loader, backhoe and dumptrucks) to augment in the clearing operations in the affected barangays of Lemery.
- Issued a memorandum addressed to all DILG Provincial/City Directors for the reactivation of the Local Price Coordinating Councils to ensure that all LCE's adopt measures to address hoarding and exorbitant price increases of essential/prime commodities.

**D. COST OF ASSISTANCE (TAB G)**

- A total amount of **₱ 23,460,767.40** worth of relief assistance was provided to the affected families. The **Local Government Units (LGUs)** provided **₱ 5,295,108.20**, **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** provisioned **₱ 948,400.00**, **Department of Health granted ₱ 6,276,513.12**, while the **Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)** allocated **₱ 10,940,746.08**.
- **NCR** received the biggest allocation based on the extent of damages in the aforementioned region.

**E. SEARCH AND RESCUE (SAR) OPERATIONS (TAB H)**

- SAR operations were effected through the concerted efforts of the SAR units of AFP, PCG and PNP and around **13,229** personnel, **182** vehicles and **275** sea crafts were mobilized to various areas in Metro Manila

  - NCR** – All Cities
  - REGION I** - Pangasinan
  - REGION III** - Pampanga, Bulacan, Zambales and Bataan.
  - REGION IV-A** - Laguna, Rizal (Rodriguez, Cainta, Binangonan and Angono), Cavite and Batangas
- As of 09 August 2012, Government offices on (except for emergency and relief operations): Malolos, Bulacan, Bocaue, Bulacan (Calumpit and San Mateo only), Pampanga (Angeles City only)

**Effects of Southwest Monsoon  
ACTIONS TAKEN  
As of 09 August 2012, 5:00 PM**

**A. NATIONAL**

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** was upgraded from BLUE ALERT to RED ALERT STATUS as of 4:45 AM, 07 August 2012 and is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels.
- Conducted Emergency meeting with the President Benigno Simeon Cojuangco Aquino III and was presided by Sec. Voltaire Gazmin, Chairperson of NDRRMC. It was attended by the Secretaries from different agencies namely: **PAGASA, DOST, DOTC, MMDA, DSWD, DILG, DOH, DPWH, DepEd, AFP, PNP and PCG**. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities.
- Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 33 suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in National Capital Region and the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Bulacan, Laguna, Cavite and Rizal today, 07 August 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
- **DOH:**
  - **CHD III** conducted assessment on evacuation centers in Calumpit and Malolos City, Bulacan providing ₱ 50,000.00 worth of drugs and medicines to Provincial Health Team Office.
  - **DOH IV-A** provided ₱ 350,000 worth of different medicines and ₱ 100,000 worth of dextrochlorpheniramine capsules and prophylaxis to evacuation centers by field office to anticipate the influx of diseases especially Leptospirosis.
- **PRC Rizal Chapter** conducted relief operations in San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal
- **AFP:**
  - **161 Battalion** deployed 1 squad from Headquarters Company to Tanay, Rizal
  - **12 Disaster Response Unit (DRU) Charlie Company** conducted relief operations and facilitated evacuation of civilians trapped in deeply flooded areas in San Mateo, Rizal
  - **SOLCOM Commander** advised all operating units to coordinate to the LDRRMCs in their respective AORs and be prepared to assist in their operations as need arises.
  - **AFP RESCOM NHQ** assisted in the evacuation on Gen. Trias and Bacoar, Cavite.
  - **RESCOM** deployed fifty (50) raincoats and twenty six (26) boots.

Advance Command Posts (ACP) were initiated in strategic locations to provide assistance to the identified areas. - **PNP CAR assisting in the monitoring of road conditions and status of communities at high risk areas. Response teams with tools, equipment on standby for deployment**
- **PIA CAR continuously assisting OCD in the dissemination of warning advisories to the general public to stay at home or in safer areas during this weather.**

**A. NATIONAL**

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** was upgraded from BLUE ALERT to RED ALERT STATUS as of 4:45 AM, 07 August 2012 and is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels.
- Conducted Emergency meeting with the President Benigno Simeon Cojuangco Aquino III and was presided by Sec. Voltaire Gazmin, Chairperson of NDRRMC. It was attended by the Secretaries from different agencies namely: **PAGASA, DOST, DOTC, MMDA, DSWD, DILG, DOH, DPWH, DepEd, AFP, PNP and PCG**. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities.
- Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 33 suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in National Capital Region and the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Bulacan, Laguna, Cavite and Rizal today, 07 August 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
- **DOH:**
  - **CHD III** conducted assessment on evacuation centers in Calumpit and Malolos City, Bulacan providing ₱ 50,000.00 worth of drugs and medicines to Provincial Health Team Office.
  - **DOH IV-A** provided ₱ 350,000 worth of different medicines and ₱ 100,000 worth of dextrochlorpheniramine capsules and prophylaxis to evacuation centers by field office to anticipate the influx of diseases especially Leptospirosis.
- **PRC Rizal Chapter** conducted relief operations in San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal
- **AFP:**
  - **161 Battalion** deployed 1 squad from Headquarters Company to Tanay, Rizal
  - **12 Disaster Response Unit (DRU) Charlie Company** conducted relief operations and facilitated evacuation of civilians trapped in deeply flooded areas in San Mateo, Rizal
  - **SOLCOM Commander** advised all operating units to coordinate to the LDRRMCs in their respective AORs and be prepared to assist in their operations as need arises.
