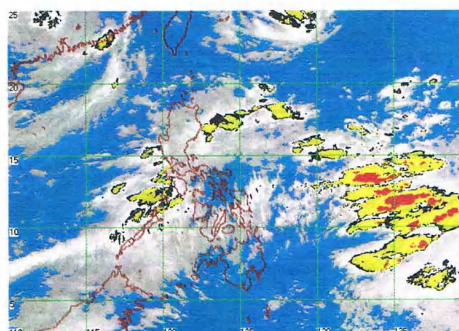

I. WEATHER SITUATION: (As of 10:30 AM, 04 August 2012)

At 8:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on satellite and surface data at 1,070 km East of Northern Luzon (16.7°N, 134.0°E). It is still too far to affect any part of the country.



Meanwhile, the Southwest Monsoon will continue to bring scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over Luzon and Visayas becoming widespread rains over Western section of Luzon which may continue to trigger flashfloods and landslides.

II. SITUATION OVERVIEW

EFFECTS:

A. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)

- As of 11:00 PM, 4 August 2012, a total of **eighty four (84) incidents** occurred in the various regions of the country due to the effects of TS Gener enhanced by the Low Pressure Area (LPA) and southwest monsoon. Out of which, **thirty one (31)** were caused by maritime incidents, **eleven (11)** were caused by flooding, and others were caused by landslide, falling debris, drowning, storm surge, overflowed rivers, flashfloods, mishaps, mudflow and collapsed structure.

B. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

- To date, the total number of population affected in **1,207 Barangays / 150 municipalities / 28 cities** in the **35 provinces** of Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XI, XII CAR and NCR is: **190,196 families/ 858,534 persons.**
- There were additional **one hundred thirty (130) affected Barangays** from NCR, Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, XI and CAR.
- Total number of population currently served inside and outside evacuation centers is **50,853 families/ 236,960 persons**

- There is an increase in number of affected families/persons but there is a decrease in the number of evacuation centers and in the number of families/persons inside the evacuation centers. As per DSWD, people have opted to return to their homes due to the improving weather situation.

C. CASUALTIES (TAB C)

- As of 04 August 2012, there are forty five (45) reportedly dead, of which: twenty six (26) are related to drowning, eleven (11) are due to fallen tree (part), and the others are related to landslide and electrocution. There are thirty five (35) reported injured and six (6) are missing. One hundred forty three (143), most of whom are fisherfolks, were rescued.
- Two individuals who were previously listed as injured are now listed in the rescued group from Super Shuttle 1 “Roro” and eight (8) fishermen were rescued in Bataan as of 30 July 2012.

D. STATUS OF LIFELINES

1. CONDITIONS OF ROADS AND BRIDGES (TAB D)

- As of 04 August 2012, a total of seventy two (72) roads were affected, of which, thirty seven (37) were from Valenzuela City in NCR due to flooding. Five (5) bridges were not passable from Regions I, II, III, IV-B and X.

- The water releases is expected to affect the low-lying areas along the Angat River from Norzagaray and Hagonoy.
- The following municipalities in Pangasinan: San Manuel, San Nicolas, Tayug, Sta Maria, Asingan, Villasis, Alcala, Bautista, Rosales and Bayambang are expected to be affected when San Roque , Ambuklao and Binga dams releases water.
- All residents living in the areas near Ipo, Ambuklao, Binga and San Roque dams are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream.

E. COST OF DAMAGES (TAB E)

- As of 11:00 PM, 04 August 2012, the total cost of damages to infrastructure was ₱ 116,560,384.00 while the total cost of damages to private properties amounting to ₱ 500,000.00, most of which were from Region IV-B. There was an increase to the cost of damage to agriculture with a total estimated cost of ₱ 222,746,412.20 which were mostly damage to crops and livestock.
- The total estimated cost of damage for all sectors amount to ₱ 339,806,796.20.

F. COST OF ASSISTANCE (TAB F)

- To date, a total amount of ₱ 16,986,438.49 worth of relief assistance was provided to the affected families. The Local Government Units (LGUs) provided ₱ 5,689,488.95, Department of Health (DOH) contributed ₱ 5,240,163.84, Non- Governmental Organizations (NGOs) provisioned ₱ 654,500.00 while the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) allocated ₱ 5,402,285.70.
- Regions III, IV-A and NCR received the biggest allocation based on the damage received of the aforementioned regions.

G. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB G)

- **As of 11:00 PM, 04 August 2012**, the total number of damaged houses was 7,459. The Totally destroyed houses were 850 while the partially damaged was 6,609, most of which were from Regions IV-A, VI and NCR.

H. POWER AND WATER SUPPLY

- As 01 August 2012, there were power outages in some areas in Tuba, Tublay, Kibungan, La Trinidad and Itogon in Benguet Province and in five (5) Barangays of Baguio City; Brgy. Masukol Paombong, Bulacan; and in the entire province of Camiguin.
- **To date, there were no regional updates regarding the power restoration in aforementioned areas.**

I. FLOODED AREAS (TAB H)

- As of 6:00 AM, 04 August 2012, there are four (4) flooded areas reported in NCR; three (3) in Region I; one (1) in Region II; thirty-eight (38) in Region III; and one (1) in Region XII.
- **As of 3:00 PM, 04 August 2012, twenty eight (28) areas in Region III were still flooded. In NCR, there were three (3) flooded areas but the flooding in some Barangays in the cities of Valenzuela, Malabon and Navotas have already subsided.**
- **The flood in twelve (12) areas has subsided namely: Muntinlupa City; Claveria, Sta Teresita in Cagayan; Sta Maria, Bulakan and Paombong in Bulacan; San Luis, Pampanga; Abucay, Bagac, Morong, Orani and Orion in Bataan; and Pikit, North Cotobato.**

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS

A. NDRRMC

- Disseminated NDRRMC Advisories on Weather Advisory to all regions affected through SMS and facsimile, uploaded the same at the NDRRMC Website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants

B. MEMBER AGENCIES

- **PCG Aurora** advised fishing boats and other small sea crafts not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels were alerted against big waves.
- **PCG Bicol** alerted Coastguard Stations and Detachments within Bicol area.

 - **903rd BDE (Masbate & Sorsogon)** prepared 7 vehicles and 3 platoons on standby alert.

Monitored Ipo Dam in the province of Bulacan and major roads and bridges in AOR.
 - **MDRRMC Gerona** closely monitored dikes at Villa Paz Gerona section of the Tarlac River.
 - **MDRRMC Paniqui** is closely monitoring the dikes at Barungabong, Colibangbang and Nancamarinan Paniqui section.
 - **CDRRMC Balanga Bataan** is closely monitoring the situation in AOR.
 - **PDRRMC Bulacan** is closely monitoring the status of Ipo and Bustos Dam. Alerted residents in low-lying and mountainous areas for possible flashfloods and landslides. Closely monitoring the flooded areas in San Miguel.

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** was upgraded from BLUE ALERT to RED ALERT STATUS effective 11:00 AM, 28 July 2012 and is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels.
- Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued **MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 32** suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in Metro Manila from 2:30 PM onward, 30 July 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
- **PCG** implemented the “No Sail Policy” for all motorized banca in Aparri.
 - **PCG-Luna, La Union** rescued the two (2) fishermen and coordinated with **PDRRMC Ilocos Sur** for their way home.
 - **PCG-Maripipi Biliran** rescued five (5) fishermen and coordinated with **RDRRMC VIII** for further assistance sending the fishermen back home.
 - **PCG-STL** assisted in Search and Rescue (SAR) of the crew of the two (2) vessels that ran aground in Mabini and Batangas City.
 - **PCG Romblon and MDRRMO** conducted Search and Rescue Operation in aground M/V Shuttle RORO 1.
 - **PCG Palawan, Regional Maritime Unit, Western Command, NAVFORWEST Puerto Princesa, Puerto Princesa Police City Office and PDRRMO** jointly conducted SAR operations in the vicinity of Brgy Irawan, Puerto Princesa.
- **DA II** conducted assessment of damages to agriculture.
- **DILG-CAR** issued to LGUs a **MEMORANDUM ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION**.
- **DOH-HEMS** provided medical consultations in Regions IV-A, VI, CAR and NCR; activated **Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergencies and Disasters (SPEED)** on 01 August 2012 for Regions IV-A and NCR. SPEED is currently activated in Makati. As of 01 August 2012, DOH-HEMS prepositioned the total amount of **PhP 3,550,000.00** for assorted drugs and medicines in six (6) affected regions: II, III, IV-A, IV-B, CAR and NCR.
- **CHD IV-A** prepositioned medicines at Regional and extension offices and recommended the activation of SPEED in flooded areas. RHU Mabitac, Laguna provided Doxycycline Prophylaxis to the affected families. Provided assorted medicines worth PhP 55,411.35 to the Province of Cavite and PhP 5,000.00 to Brgy. Banaba, San Mateo, Rizal. Allocated the requested one thousand (1,000) capsules of Doxycycline to the five (5) provinces: Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon.
- **DPWH III** maintenance crew installed road warning signs and sandbagging and conducting continuous remedial action.
- **DPWH IV-A and DPWH CAR** conducted road clearing and declogging operations, repaired damaged roads and prepositioned heavy equipment and maintenance crew.

- **DPWH IV-B** maintenance crew were deployed in the area to monitor the situation and installed warning devices to cautions commuters

- **PRC** extended food packs to Brgy. Culipapa, Hinobaan, Negros Occidental: 40 packs containing 5 kg of rice, 5 cans sardines, 5 pouches noodles and 5 boxes of biscuits.
- **PRC-West Rizal Branch** staff and 143 volunteers distributed hot meals at the evacuated areas.
- **AFP-JTF** provided **DSWD-NCR** two (2) M35 trucks ICOW transport of relief goods in Quezon City and Navotas City
- **AFP of 56th Infantry Battalion – Phil Army dispatched two (2) trucks to the Municipality of Obando to transport stranded commuters on or about 1:00 PM, 02 August 2012.**
- **AFP-SOLCOM** provided support in the evacuation of affected families in Rodriguez, San Mateo and Tanay, Rizal. Assisted in the evacuation operations in Tanza and Naic, Cavite.
 - Twelve (12) DRO of Charlie Company from 202nd Brigade assisted MDRRMO Rodriguez, Rizal in relief distribution and provision of security to the 295 evacuated families.
 - Naval Sangley Point based in Cavite City assisted in the evacuation and relief distribution in Cavite City, Noveleta and Kawit.

B. REGIONAL

RDRRMC III

Distributed sandbags to various municipalities / barangays to augment the sandbagging operations being conducted by the LGUs.
 - **MDRRMC Castillejos** provided tents for the evacuees of Sitio San Isidro and Brgy San Pablo.
 - **PEO Zambales conducted clearing operations in Brgy Balincaguig-Paite Road, San Felipe, Zambales due to landslide. They are doing the rehab of the eroded Zambales dike.**
- **PDRRMC and PSWDO** distributed 50 packs of relief goods to the affected families in Brgy. Lipay and 100 packs of relief goods to Brgy. Babuyan, both in Sta. Cruz, Zambales.

- **PDRRMU Pampanga provided four (4) dump trucks of filling materials.**
- **PDRRMO and PSWDO provided 100 packs of relief goods to the affected families in Brgy Babuyan, Sta Cruz and Brgy Lipay, Sta Cruz**
- **CDRRMC Cabanatuan City** provided relief assistance to the affected population.
- **MDRRMC Mariveles, Bataan** conducted SAR Operations on the alleged missing fisherman.

- **MDRRMCs Cardona and Angono** reported that the water in Laguna Lake is in critical level as of 3:00 PM, 31 July 2012.
- **BDRRMCs in San Mateo** provided food for their respective evacuees.
- **MHO** gave medical attention to four (4) sick evacuees in Baras, Rizal.
- **MDRRMO San Mateo, Rizal**, conducted pre-emptive evacuation of 10 families in Brgy Sta Ana due to the rise in water level of the Batasan River as of 9:45 AM, 01 August 2012
- **BDRRMCs in San Mateo** provided food for their respective evacuees.

RDRRMC V

- **OCD V** coordinated with PCG and PNP Pilar, Sorsogon to facilitate transfer of passengers from the RORO to dry land using a rubber boat borrowed from LGU Pilar. Continuously coordinated with PDRRMCs and Police PPOs re weather situation and conducted preparation of relief goods for distribution to families affected by storm surge in Bulan, Sorsogon.
