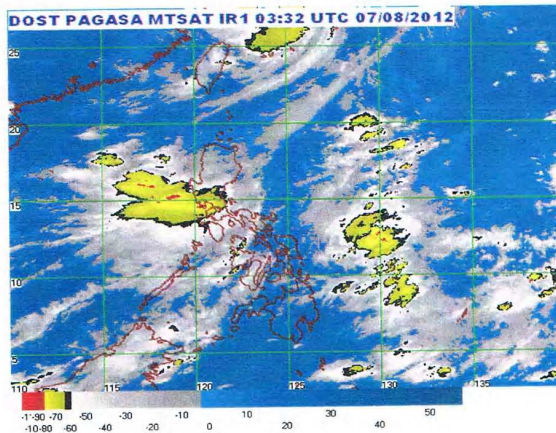

I. WEATHER SITUATION: (As of 11:00 AM, 07 August 2012)

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "Haikui" located 300 km Northeast of Taiwan will continue to bring occasional to frequent rains over Luzon becoming moderate to heavy rains in the Provinces of Ilocos, La Union, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Bulacan, Rizal, Cavite, Laguna, Batangas and National Capital Region today until tomorrow with gradual improvement of weather condition by Thursday and onwards to the weekend. Expect landslides/flashfloods in mountainous areas and floods in low lying areas.



II. SITUATION OVERVIEW

EFFECTS:

A. INCIDENTS MONITORED

- Widespread flooding was reported in the NCR particularly in the cities of Valenzuela, Malabon, Muntinlupa, Makati, Navotas, Parañaque, Quezon, Marikina and Pasig.
- Flooding is also reported in Calasiao, Pangasinan; Meycauayan and Obando in Bulacan; Cardona, Rizal; Sta. Rosa, Biñan, Calamba, San Pedro, Cabuyao, Los Baños Bay, Victoria, Sta. Cruz, Lumban, Paete, Pakil, Pangil, Siniloan, Mabitac, Sta. Maria and Famy in Laguna; and Noveleta and Gen. Trias in Cavite.

B. AFFECTED POPULATION

- As of 11:00 PM, 06 August 2012, the total population affected in *NCR, Region I, Region III, and Region IV-A* is **179,0261 families / 808,697 persons.**
- The total number population currently served inside and outside evacuation centers is **53,951 families/ 250,200 persons**

4,040 families / 18,692 persons
49,911 families / 231,508 persons

- As of this date, there are no reported casualties reported related to the effects of Southwest Monsoon.

D. STATUS OF LIFELINES

CONDITIONS OF ROADS AND BRIDGES

- To date, the following roads in NCR are still not passable to light vehicles, particularly:
 - Valenzuela City: Brgys Pasolo, Palasan, Poblacion Bisig P Villa and Balangkas
 - Malabon: Brgys. Santulan and Dampalit
 - Muntinlupa: Brgys. Poblacion, Cupang Tunasan, Buli and Putatan
 - Navotas: Brgys. Sipac and Tangos
 - Parañaque: Brgys. Tambo and Vitalez
 - Quezon City: Brgys. Damayan and Roxas
- In Pampanga, the roads not passable to all type of vehicles:
 - Manalin, Brgy Rd Brgy Maniago
 - Macabebe, Tacasan-Saplud David Rd and Brgy San Gabriel
 - Guagua, San Nicolas 1st, Sto Cristo and Mac Arthur Highway (Unelevated portion not passable to light vehicles)

2. STATUS OF DAMS AND WATERWAYS (As of 10:00 AM, 07 August 2012)

- Closely monitored are the following dams which are now in spilling levels: Angat and Ipo in Bulacan, La Mesa in Quezon City, Ambulao and Binga in Benguet, San Roque in Pangasinan and Pantabangan in Nueva Ecija

- The following municipalities in Pangasinan: San Manuel, San Nicolas, Tayug, Sta Maria, Asingan, Villasis, Alcala, Bautista, Rosales and Bayambang are expected to be affected while Ambuklao, Binga and San Roque dams are releasing water.
- All residents living in the areas near Ipo, Ambuklao, Binga and San Roque dams are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream.

E. COST OF ASSISTANCE

- As per DSWD, as of 06 August 2012, the total amount of **₱ 12,994,213.85** worth of relief assistance was provided to the affected families. The **Local Government Units (LGUs)** provided **₱ 6,232,911.95**, **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** provisioned **₱ 654,500.00** while the **Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)** allocated **₱ 6,106,801.90**.

J. SUSPENSION OF CLASSES

- Classes are suspended in the following:

NCR

- All Levels in: Manila, Las Piñas, Muntinlupa City, Navotas, Taguig, Pateros, San Juan City, Parañaque, Pasay City, Makati City, Marikina City, Caloocan City and Valenzuela City
- Preschool to High School in Pasig City, Quezon City and Mandaluyong City

- In Malabon City: City of Malabon University, City of Polytechnic Institute, I Learn Center of Malabon and Miriam Academy of Malabon

REGION III

- All Levels in: Bataan (Balanga, Pilar and Hermosa), Zambales (San Felipe and Bulacan (Obando)
- Candaba, Pampanga (San Agustin Elementary School)
- Pre-School to Elementary: Botolan, Zambales

REGION IV-A

- All Levels in: Rizal (Cainta, Binangonan, San Mateo, Taytay and Rodriguez), Laguna and Cavite (Bacoor, Rosario and Imus)
- Preschool to High School in: Angono, Rizal; Kawit and General Trias in Cavite

III. ACTIONS TAKEN

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels. Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
 - Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 33 suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in National Capital Region and the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Bulacan, Laguna, Cavite and Rizal today, 07 August 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
