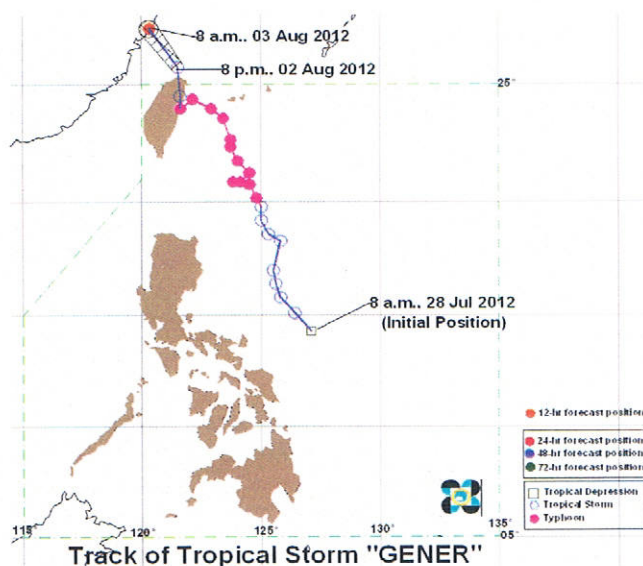

### I. CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS:

At 11:00 AM 28 July 2012, the Active Low Pressure Area East Northeast of Borongan, Eastern Samar has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "GENER". At 5:00 PM of the same day, TD "GENER" intensified rapidly into a Tropical Storm (TS) while moving in north northwest direction.

TS "GENER" has intensified into a typhoon as it continues to move to the extreme Northern Luzon at 5:00 PM 30 July 2012. And as of 11:00 PM of the same day, typhoon "GENER" was at 240 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes moving North Northwest.



At 5:00 PM 01 August 2012, typhoon "GENER" continued to move northward to the vicinity of East Taiwan-Rukyu Area and made it's landfall over Northern Taiwan at 5:00 AM 02 August 2012.

Typhoon "GENER" weakened into Tropical Storm at 6:00 PM 02 August 2012 and at 11:00PM continues to move away from the country and moving North Northwest.

- A total of **seventy nine (79)** incidents occurred in various regions due to continuous rains caused by Tropical Storm "GENER" (SAOLA).

- All residents living in the aforementioned areas are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream.
- As of 10:05 AM 02 August 2012, the Magat FFWS Dam Office has announced dam release for flood control.
- As of 9:00 PM, 02 August 2012, water level in Laguna Lake is 12.59m (above normal which is 12.5m)
- As of 2:00 AM 03 August 2012, Angat, Ipo and La Mesa closed their gates.

## I. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB G)

- As of 04 August 2012, the total number of damaged houses is 4,883. The Totally damaged houses were 756 while the partially damaged was 4,127.

## J. POWER AND WATER SUPPLY

### CAR

- As of 9:30 AM, 01 August 2012, there is an ongoing power outage in some areas in Tuba, Tublay, Kibungan, La Trinidad and Itogon in Benguet Province and in five (5) Barangays of Baguio City.

### Region III

- As of 10:00 AM 01 August 2012, electric power of Brgy. Masukol Paombong, Bulacan was temporarily cut-off.

### Region X

- As of 11:00 AM, 01 August 2012, the entire province of Camiguin has an ongoing power outage.

## K. FLOODED AREAS (TAB H)

- As of 6:00 AM, 04 August 2012, there are four (4) flooded areas reported in NCR; three (3) in Region I; one (1) in Region II; thirty-eight (38) in Region III; and one (1) in Region XII.

## IV. ACTIONS TAKEN

### A. NATIONAL

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** was upgraded from BLUE ALERT to RED ALERT STATUS effective 11:00 AM 28 July 2012 and is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels.
- Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued **MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 32** suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in Metro Manila from 2:30 PM onward, 30 July 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
- **PCG-Aparri** implemented the "No Sail Policy" for all motorized banca within their Area of Responsibility (AOR).
- **PCG-Salomague** was not able to conduct SAR operation for the two (2) missing fishermen due to unfavourable sea condition in Region I. They advised all coastal Barangays to be on the lookout for the said fishermen and conduct assistance if they spot them.
- **PCG-Luna, La Union** rescued the two (2) fishermen and coordinated with **PDRRMC Ilocos Sur** for their way home.
- **PCG-Maripipi Biliran** rescued five (5) fishermen and coordinated with **RDRRMC VIII** for further assistance sending the fishermen back home.
- **PCG-STL** assisted in Search and Rescue of the crew of the two (2) vessels that ran aground in Mabini and Batangas City on 30 July 2012.
- **PCG Romblon and MDRRMO** conducted Search and Rescue Operation in aground M/V Shuttle RORO 1.
- **PCG Palawan, Regional Maritime Unit, Western Command, NAVFORWEST Puerto Princesa, Puerto Princesa Police City Office and PDRRMO** jointly conducted SAR operations in the vicinity of Brgy Irawan, Puerto Princesa.



- **DA II** conducted assessment of damages to agriculture.
- **DA-RFU 1 is continuously monitoring the agricultural impact of the effects of GENER.**
- **CGDBCL** alerted Stations and Detachments within Bicol area.
- **DILG-CAR** issued to LGUs a **MEMORANDUM ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION.**
- **DOH-HEMS** raised CODE WHITE ALERT since 30 July 2012 still in effect. Medical consultations were provided in Regions IV-A, VI, CAR and NCR; activated Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergencies and Disasters (SPEED) on 01 August 2012 for Regions IV-A and NCR. SPEED is currently activated in Makati. As of 01 August 2012, DOH-HEMS prepositioned the total amount of PhP 3,550,000.00 for assorted drugs and medicines in six (6) affected regions: II, III, IV-A, IV-B, CAR and NCR.
- **CHD IV-A** prepositioned medicines at Regional and extension offices and recommended the activation of SPEED in flooded areas. RHU Mabitac, Laguna provided Doxycycline Prophylaxis to the affected families. Provided assorted medicines worth PhP 55,411.35 to the Province of Cavite and PhP 5,000.00 to Brgy. Banaba, San Mateo, Rizal. Allocated the requested one thousand (1,000) capsules of Doxycycline to the five (5) provinces: Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon.
- **DPWH III** maintenance crew installed road warning signs and sandbagging and conducting continuous remedial action.
- **DPWH IV-A and DPWH CAR** conducted road clearing and declogging operations, repaired damaged roads and prepositioned heavy equipment and maintenance crew.
- **DPWH IV-B** maintenance crew were deployed in the area to monitor the situation and installed warning devices to cautions commuters
- **DSWD CO** prepositioned P4.77 million standby funds and P39.04 million worth of relief supplies in all DSWD-FOs along the typhoon path, amounting to P43.82 million.

- **DSWD Field Office I** prepositioned relief goods to the province of Pangasinan ready for augmentation support to typhoon victims; **and QUART Teams have been reactivated for possible pre-emptive evacuation of disaster prone areas in the Region.**
- **DSWD III and RD Apostol of DSWD III** proceed to Obando, Bulacan for relief operations on 03 August 2012.
- **DSWD-CAR and DSWD IV-B** provided food packs to families inside and outside evacuation centers and strandeers.
- **DSWD IV-A** provided food to the families inside and outside evacuation centers in affected areas in the provinces of Cavite, Rizal and Laguna; Regional Quick Response Team is continuously monitoring the effects of TY GENER; DSWD IV-A distributed 3,124 family food packs amounting Php 786,502.00.

- **DSWD V** provided LGU Pilar with 300 food packs, 200 packs of rice and soy meals, 33 500ml bottles of water, 23 250ml bottles of water, and 150 packs of soup mix for the strandeers in Pilar port amounting to Php 89,904.00
- **DSWD X provided food assistance to the affected families of the storm surge in Misamis Oriental.**
- **DSWD NCR** requested for two (2) 6x6 trucks to transport relief goods from Parañaque to CAMANAVA area. OCD NCR coordinated the request to the Joint Task Force was approved. The truck will be at DSWD warehouse in Parañaque at 12:00 NN 03 August 2012.
  - **Provided 120 blankets to the affected families in Brgy. Bagong Silangan, Quezon City through the request of Cong. Winnie Castillo.**
  - **Provided 300 family packs, 150 blankets, 150 mattresses to the affected families in Brgy. 105 Manila through the request of MDSW.**
  - **Provided 300 family packs and 300 mattresses in different evacuation centers in Navotas City through the request of CSWO.**
- **PRC** extended food packs to Brgy. Culipapa, Hinobaan, Negros Occidental: 40 packs containing 5 kg. of rice, 5 cans sardines, 5 pouches noodles and 5 boxes of biscuits.
- **PRC-Phil Red Cross West Rizal Branch** staff and 143 volunteers distributed hot meals at the evacuated areas.
- **AFP-SOLCOM** provided support in the evacuation of affected families in Rodriguez, San Mateo and Tanay, Rizal. Assisted the evacuation operations in Tanza and Naic, Cavite.
  - Twelve (12) DRO of Charlie Company from 202<sup>nd</sup> Brigade assisted MDRRMO Rodriguez, Rizal in relief distribution and provision of security to the 295 evacuated families.
  - Naval Sangley Point based in Cavite City assisted in the evacuation and relief distribution in Cavite City, Noveleta and Kawit.
- **PNP assists in monitoring the road conditions in affected areas in CAR**
- **NSRC conducted Manila Clean-Up Drive. A total of 253 members of NSRC with AFP Reservist, PCG, and MMDA participated in the clean-up drive.**

## **B. REGIONAL**

### **RDRRMC I**

- **PDRRMC WASAR and PHERT** were requested to conduct pre-emptive evacuation of students at Brgy Sabangan, Binmaley due to rising water brought about by rainwater and high tide.
- **PDRRMC Pangasinan conducted an Emergency Meeting on Operational Preparedness and Readiness of its Member Agencies and was presided over by Gov. Amado T. Espino on 02 August 2012. A technical group was established and tasked to give timely and effective response for any untoward eventualities.**

### **RDRRMC III**

- **PDRRMC Zambales** distributed 100 packs of food to the affected families in Castillejos, and conducted sandbagging in the dikes of San Felipe and San Narciso – San Marcelino. Distributed sandbags to various municipalities / Barangays to augment the sandbagging operations being conducted by the LGUs.
  - **MDRRMC Castillejos** provided tents for the evacuees of Sitio San Isidro and Brgy San Pablo.
- **PSWDO and PDRRMC** distributed 50 packs of relief goods to the affected families in Brgy. Lipay and 100 packs of relief goods to Brgy. Babuyan, both in Sta. Cruz, Zambales.



- **PDRRMC Nueva Ecija** OPCEN was activated since 28 July 2012 and is continuously monitoring the status of Pantabangan Dam. Disseminated advisories and alerted responders for possible evacuation.
- **PDRRMC Nueva Ecija, DPWH and PNP** assisted and provided signage at the scoured portion of the road located at km 188 Brgy. Piut Carranglan, Nueva Ecija.
- **CDRRMC Cabanatuan City** provided relief assistance to the affected population.
- **MDRRMC Mariveles, Bataan** conducted SAR Operations on the alleged missing fisherman.
- **CDRRMO Olongapo, SAR Personnel, Coast Guard, PNP Maritime and SBMA Rescue** conducted search and recovery operations. As of 7:00 AM 03 August 2012, retrieval operations still on-going.

#### **RDRRMC IV-A**

- **OCD IV-A** informed DZXL and GMA News Room about the suspension of classes in CALABARZON.
- **MDRRMCs Cardona and Angono** reported that the water in Laguna Lake is in critical level as of 3:00 PM, 31 July 2012.
- **BDRRMCs in San Mateo** provided food for their respective evacuees.
- **MHO** gave medical attention to four (4) sick evacuees in Baras, Rizal.
- **MDRRMO San Mateo, Rizal**, conducted pre-emptive evacuation of 10 families in Brgy Sta Ana due to the rise in water level of the Batasan River as of 9:45 AM, 01 August 2012
- Antipolo Rescue Teams cleared the fallen trees; assisted in the evacuation of affected families.
- **RDRRMC IV-A and OCD IV-A** had an emergency meeting with MDRRMC Mabitac and representatives of PDRRMC Laguna at the Mabitac Municipal Bldg at 1:00 PM 31 July 2012. Immediate needs and long-term solutions to the flooding, enhancement of EWS of the Municipalities of Mabitac and Sta. Maria including IEC activities were discussed in the said meeting.
- **RDRRMC Chairperson, OCD IV-A and representative from DSWD IV-A** had an Emergency Meeting with MDRRMOs San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal in their respective Municipal Hall on 01 August 2012, to assess the extent of the damage brought by TY GENER and Southwest Monsoon.

#### **RDRRMC V**

- **OCD V** coordinated with PCG and PNP Pilar, Sorsogon to facilitate transfer of passengers from the RORO to dry land using a rubber boat borrowed from LGU Pilar. Continuously coordinated with PDRRMCs and Police PPOs re weather situation.
- **OCD V** conducted preparation of relief goods which contain the following: Cooking set (30 pcs); Dinnerware (69 pcs); Male Personal Clothing (69 pcs); Female Personal Clothing (69 pcs); Toddler Personal Clothing (69 pcs); Infant Personal Clothing (69 pcs); Sleeping Mat (89 pcs); Thermal Blanket Queen Size ( 27 pcs); Thermal Blanket Twin Size (62 pcs); Water Container 5 Gallons (74 pcs; and 2.5 Gallon Water Container (74 pcs). For distribution to families affected by storm surge in Bulan, Sorsogon.
- **NFSL-Navy** dispatched one (1) M35 truck to transport non-food relief goods to Sorsogon provincial capitol for distribution to the families affected by storm surge in Bulan, Sorsogon.

#### **RDRRMC VI**

- **PDRRMC NEGROS OCCIDENTAL and LDRRMC BAGO CITY** are currently monitoring situation and conducting relief operations to the families in the evacuation centers and the affected areas.
- **PDRRMC NEGROS OCCIDENTAL** extended relief assistance to the following:
  - 344 family packs containing 3 kilos of rice, 3 tins sardines, 3 pouches noodles, 10 sacks of rice, 6 boxes sardines and 9 boxes noodles.
  - 50 family packs containing 3 kilos of rice, 3 tin cans of sardines, and 3 pouches of noodles to MDRRMC Valladolid.
  - 38 family packs containing 3 kilos of rice, 3 tins of sardines and 3 pouches of noodle to MDRRMC EB Magalona



- **LGU of Hinoba-an, Negros Occidental** extended **12 sacks of rice, 10 boxes of sardines and 10 boxes of noodles**
- **MDRRMO BUGASONG, ANTIQUE** with the help of local folks recovered the victim's body at around 1:00 PM, 28 July 2012 during the conduct of Search and Retrieval operation.
- **MDRRMO of Kalibo, Aklan** provided relief assistance to the families affected in the evacuation area located at the Aklan Catholic College Gym
- **LGU OF BAGO CITY** extended family packs to affected families.

#### **RDRRMC X**

- **MDRRMO Sapad** and provided food assistance and conducted search and rescue operations together with Sapad, Lanao Del Norte Municipal Police Station and 35IB.
- **MDRRMO Sultan Naga Dimaporo, Lanao Del Norte** conducted search and rescue operations with 35IB and clearing operations of the national road at Barangay Bangaan.

#### **RDRRMC XII**

- **LDRRMC Pikit, North Cotabato** conducted DANA on the flooded areas and prepared for evacuation.

#### **RDRRMC CAR**

- **OCD CAR** coordinated with PPO and PDRRMO of Ifugao and DOH-CAR regarding the Motor Vehicular Accident in Hingyon, Ifugao.
- **PDRRMC Benguet** issued advisory on the temporary suspension of classes. Issued memorandum on the temporary suspension of Small Scale Mining Activities in Benguet; Mobilized Provincial Heavy Equipment to conduct road clearing operation; **and conducted road clearing operation (heavy equipment and manual work).**
- **Cordillera Regional DANA** team deployed to conduct rapid assessment within Baguio and Benguet province.
- Pre-emptive evacuation was given priority to high risk communities that were identified as the following: Brgy. City Camp, Baguio City • Brgy. Puguis, La Trinidad • Brgy. Ambassador, Tublay • Brgy. Luneta, Itogon and Camp 6, Tuba in the province of Benguet.

#### **RDRRMC ARMM**

- **OCD ARMM** has been activated since 28 July 2012. Conducted ocular visit and verification/validation of the flooded areas in Sultan Kudarat.

**Effects of Typhoon “GENER”  
PREPAREDNESS MEASURES  
As of 6:00 AM, 04 August 2012**

**NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS**

**A. NDRRMC**

- Disseminated NDRRMC Advisories on Weather Advisory to all regions affected through SMS and facsimile, uploaded the same at the NDRRMC Website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants

**B. MEMBER AGENCIES**

- **PCG Aurora** advised fishing boats and other small sea crafts not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels were alerted against big waves.
- **PCG Bicol** alerted Coastguard Stations and Detachments within Bicol area.
- **PRO IV-A** alerted all Police Provincial Offices to monitor weather situation and report any untoward incident to the LDRRMCs Operation Center.
- **DSWD – I** pre-positioning of family packs; activated SWAD team for any eventuality; and QUART Teams have been reactivated for possible pre-emptive evacuation of disaster prone areas in the Region.
- **DSWD – II** has 905 family food packs, 2,304 relief clothing and Php 483,404.82 standby funds ready for augmentation to affected LGUs. They alerted the Field Office Disaster management Response Teams and SWAD Teams particularly in the provinces of Batanes, Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino and Nueva Vizcaya.
- **DSWD – III** is continuously coordinating with the OCD Region III for updates of TS Gener. The SWAD and Quick Response Team (QRT) are on alert status and advised to make precautionary actions. 500 Family Food Packs are prepositioned for SWAD Bulacan for augmentation.
- **DSWD V** prepositioned minimum stockpile of 2,000 food packs and standby fund. Alerted Social Welfare Officers to monitor provinces for affected population.
- **DPWH-FO2** is continuously monitoring the conditions of all major roads and bridges. Heavy equipment is ready for deployment.
- **PNP Search and Rescue Teams** are already on alert and ready for deployment.
- **PNP Cordillera** has implemented its DRRM plan LOI 35/10 “OPLAN Saklolo”, assisted OCD in dissemination of weather and warning advisories, and activated all PPOs.
- **PNP-PRO IV-A, BFP IV-A, AFP(SOLCOM) and PCG-STL** have alerted their provincial, city and municipal units to monitor weather situation in their AORs and assist in the evacuation and SAR as needed.
- **PIA-CAR** assisted OCD in dissemination of weather and warning advisories.
- **PIA IV-A** assisted RDRRMC IV-A in disseminating the advisories and provision of updates.
- **BFP** automatically implemented contingencies on flood and assists in evacuation.
- **DOH CAR** prepositioned medicines and other health concerned logistics.
- **DOH IV-A** prepositioned medicines at Regional and extension offices.



- **PHOs** coordinated with **PDRRMC, MDRRMC** and assisted **RHU** in **WASH** and health education activities.
- **PHTOs** conducted rapid health assessment in the Provinces of Rizal, Cavite, Laguna and Batangas
- **AFP 9ID, PA**
  - **901<sup>st</sup> BDE (Albay & Catanduanes)** prepared 12 vehicles and 2 platoons of troops on standby alert in Albay; 6 vehicles and 1 platoon in Catanduanes.
  - **902<sup>nd</sup> BDE (Camarines Norte and Sur)** 3 DRTUs, 6km250, 10km450 ready to be utilized.
  - **903<sup>rd</sup> BDE (Masbate & Sorsogon)** prepared 7 vehicles and 3 platoons on standby alert.
  - **TOG (AIRFORCE)** alerted 10-man team for possible rescue operation; 1 carrier truck on standby.
- **NFSL (NAVY) – Disaster Response Team** on standby alert status.

#### **REGIONAL PREPAREDNESS:**

- **RDRRMCs I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, ARMM, CAR and NCR** disseminated weather and flood bulletins to all concerned local DRRMCs, RDRRMC member agencies, the tri media thru facsimile and SMS, and to several fishermen associations.
- **RDRRMCs I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, ARMM, CAR and NCR** are closely monitoring the AOR and closely coordinating with P/MDRRMCs regarding effects of TS Gener.
- **RDRRMC I** operations center activated since 30 July 2012.
  - **PDRRMC Ilocos Norte** prepositioned relief goods for rescue and relief operations.
- **RDRRMC II** coordinated with Local DRRMCs regarding situation in their AOR and preparedness activities undertaken. “No Sail Policy” is still in effect for all motorized banca within their Area of Responsibility due to rough seas.
- **RDRRMC III** Emergency Operation Center was on Red Alert Status since 28 July 2012 and continuously monitoring the effects of Typhoon “GENER” in AOR. Continuously monitoring status of major roads and bridges, class suspension and situation in AOR. Relayed Hydrological Dam Situationer for Ipo Dam water released issued 8:00 AM 19 July 2012. Monitored Ipo Dam in the province of Bulacan and major roads and bridges in AOR.
  - **MDRRMC Gerona** closely monitored dikes at Villa Paz Gerona section of the Tarlac River.
  - **MDRRMC Paniqui** is closely monitoring the dikes at Barungabong, Colibangbang and Nancamarinan Paniqui section.
  - **CDRRMC Balanga Bataan** is closely monitoring the situation in AOR.
  - **PDRRMC Bulacan** is closely monitoring the status of Ipo and Bustos Dam. Alerted residents in low-lying and mountainous areas for possible flashfloods and landslides. Closely monitoring the flooded areas in San Miguel.
  - **Zambales Disaster Response Team (PEO), PDRRMO and PSWDO** conducted ocular inspection on the reported flooded areas in San Narciso, Castillejoz, Iba to Sta. Cruz.
- **RDRRMC IV-A** closely monitoring the status of the water level of the Teresa River.
  - **BDRRMO Morong** advised the residents living near the river to stay away from the flood control.



- **RDRRMC V and PDRRMC Catanduanes** advised fishermen not to venture out into the sea due to bad weather. **OCD V** on Heightened Alert Status; Maintains 24/7 duty personnel to monitor LDRRMCs and concerned agencies re incidents and actions taken.
  - Continuous coordination with PDRRMCs, CGDBCL and Police PPOs re weather situation and advised to closely monitor especially in low-lying areas and to report any untoward incident ICOW latest weather disturbances; incidents reported via text or sms.
  - Continuous monitoring of Bicol River Basin Area.
- **RDRRMC VI** is closely monitoring the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "GENER".
  - **CDRRMC Ilo-ilo** provided psychosocial care to the victims with totally and partially damaged houses; provided food and relief assistance to the affected families; and partially damaged houses were subjected for the re-assessment for possible shelter assistance. Continuous SAR Operation for the missing victim in Pavia, Ilo-ilo.
- **RDRRMC-CAR** is continuously monitoring the rainfall amount and the status of Binga and Ambuklao Dam. Advised PDRRMCs allocated with Emergency Telecommunications equipment to prepare their units for possible activation.
- **OCD-NCR** - Eight (8) Barangays in Quezon City are on RED ALERT STATUS: Gulod, Greater Fairview, Sta. Lucia, North Fairview, San Bartolome, Nagkaisang Nayon, Sta. Monica and Greater Lagro.
