Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**
SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 05.08.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over Gangetic West Bengal and Chhattisgarh; at many places over Orissa, Jharkhand, north Coastal Andhra Pradesh, east Madhya Pradesh, east Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at a few places over Bihar, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Karnataka and Kerala and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Rajasthan, Arunachal Pradesh, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar islands where weather remained mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (2cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Tikamgarh-5; Jagdalpur-4; Dehradun, Gaya, Mahabaleshwar, Bilaspur, Durg and Champa-3 each; Bapatla, Tehri, Mukteshwar, Hirakud, Bankura, Pahalgaoon, Baripada, Agumbe, Shirali and Bramhapuri-2 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over Odisha and Chhattisgarh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, north Andhra Pradesh, west coast and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur a few at places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states, rest Maharashtra and interior Karnataka.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over remaining parts of the country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There are 10 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 05.08.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

- 26 Teams consisting of 842 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam -14, Andhra Pradesh - 01, North Bengal-04, Maharashtra-03 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over Odisha and Chhattisgarh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, north Andhra Pradesh, west coast and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur a few at places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states, rest Maharashtra and interior Karnataka.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over remaining parts of the country.

Weather Warning

- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Jammu division of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during next 24 hours.
- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Odisha, Chhattisgarh, east Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Telangana during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rainfall would occur at many places over central and adjoining east and north peninsular India, northeastern states and west coast.
- Subdued rainfall activity would continue over western parts of the country and southeast peninsular India.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated **5th Aug**, 2012, there are 10 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

Assam & Meghalaya

- River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in district Jorhat, Assam is flowing at 85.36 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with Falling trend.
- River Brahmaputra at Dhubri in District Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 28.63 m against the danger level of 28.62 m with Falling trend.
- River Desang at Nanglamoraghat in District Sivasagar, Assam is flowing at 94.97 m against the danger level of 94.46 m with Falling trend.
- River Dhansiri(S) at Numaligarh in District Golaghat/Numalighat, Assam is flowing at 77.68 m against the danger level of 77.42 m with Falling trend.

Bihar

- River Bagmati at Benibad in District Muzafferpur/Hayaghat, Bihar is flowing at 49.22 m against the danger level of 48.68 m with Rising trend.
- River Kosi at Basua in District Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.90 m against the danger level of 47.75 m with Falling trend.

Uttar Pradesh

- River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge in Distt-Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.65 m against the danger level of 106.07 m with Steady trend.
- River Ghaghra at Ayodhya in distt- Faizabad/Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 92.90 m against the danger level of 92.73 m with Rising trend.
- River Ghaghra at Turtipar in Distt-Ballia/Balthra, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.09m against the danger level of 64.01m with Rising trend.
- River Rapti at Balrampur in Distt-Balrampur, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 104.63m against the danger level of 104.62m with Rising trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 5th Aug, 2012.

- ❖ In Assam, 14 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 475 personnel (Kamrup-21, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-34, Dhubri-66, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-149, Jorhat-31, Nagaon-37, Barpeta-31, Silchar-29) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In North Bengal, 4 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 129 personnel (Mainaguri-33, Alipurduwar-32 & Siliguri- 64) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 105 personnel (Mumbai Sub urban-35, Mumbai-70) deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 118 personnel (Mujjafarpur-31 Supoul- 35, Gopalganj-33, Dharbhanga-19) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
