SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 27.07.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over Mizoram, at many places over Gangetic West Bengal, Kerala and Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Orissa, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Telangana and coastal & north interior Karnataka and at one or two places over Jammu & Kashmir, Uttarakhand, Punjab, east Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Nagaland, Saurashtra, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalaseema and south interior Karnataka. Weather remained mainly dry over rest of the country.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/ thundershowers would occur at many places over east & central India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, north-eastern states, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over interior peninsular India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over east Rajasthan and east Uttar Pradesh and at a few places over Uttarkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

There are 08 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 27.07.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 29 Teams consisting of 981 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam −14, Andhra Pradesh − 01, Jharkhand-01, North Bengal-04, Maharashtra-03, J&K-02 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/ thundershowers would occur at many places over east & central India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, north-eastern states, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over interior peninsular India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over east Rajasthan and east Uttar Pradesh and at a few places over Uttarkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat region.

Moderate Flood Site

Assam & Meghalaya

- ➤ River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in district Jorhat, Assam is flowing at 85.66 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Brahamputra at Dhubri in District Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 29.04 m against the danger level of 28.62 m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Burhidihing at Chenimari(Khowang) in District Dibrugarh/Khowang, Assam is flowing at 102.36m against the danger level of 102.11m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Desang at Nanglamoraghat in District Sivasagar, Assam is flowing at 95.08m against the danger level of 94.46 m with Rising trend.
- ➤ River Beki at Beki NHX in District Barpeta/Sorbhog, Assam is flowing at 45.10m against the danger level of 45.10m with Rising trend.

Bihar

- ➤ River Bagmali at Benibad in district Muzafferpur/Hayaghat, Bihar is flowing at 48.96 m against the danger level of 48.68 m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Kosi at Basua in district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 48.13 m against the danger level of 47.75 m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Kosi at Baltara in district Khagaria/Choutham, Bihar is flowing at 33.88 m against the danger level of 33.85 m with Falling trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 27th</u> <u>July,</u> 2012.

- ❖ In Assam, 14 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 488 personnel (Kamrup-23, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-34, Dhubri-66, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-149, Jorhat-33, Nagaon-36, Barpeta-35, Silchar-35) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In North Bengal, 4 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 138 personnel (Mainaguri-35, Alipurdowar-34 & Siliguri- 69) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Jharkhand, 01 team of 2nd Bn NDRF consisting of 34 personnel deployed at District Deoghar for FAMEX and Sawan Mela duty.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 105 personnel (Mumbai Sub urban-35, Mumbai-70) deployed for pre monsoon duty.

- ❖ In J&K, 02 teams of 7 BN NDRF consisting of 75 personnel (Pahalgam-28 and Chandanwadi, 47) deployed for FAMEX & Amarnath Yatra duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 126 personnel (Mujjafarpur-37 Supoul- 35, Gopalganj-33, Dharbhanga-21) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
