RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall has occurred at most places over Rajasthan, west Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala and northeastern states; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, West Bengal & Sikkim, Saurashtra, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep and at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast and Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Rajasthan, Gujarat state, interior Maharashtra and central India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Odisha and Andhra Pradesh during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over north-eastern states and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over western Himalayan region, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and West Uttar Pradesh during next 24 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over interior Karnataka and at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

There are 07 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 04.09.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 20 Teams consisting of 597 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –07, West Bengal-04, Andhra Pradesh-01, Maharashtra-03, Delhi -01 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast and Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Rajasthan, Gujarat state, interior Maharashtra and central India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Odisha and Andhra Pradesh during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over north-eastern states and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over western Himalayan region, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and West Uttar Pradesh during next 24 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over interior Karnataka and at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

Weather Warning

- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Odisha, Chattisgarh, Vidarbha, Marathawada, Madhya Pradesh and Telangana during next 48 hours.
- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Gujarat, Madhya Maharashtra and coastal Karnataka and extremely heavy rainfall (>=25 cm) over Konkan & Goa (including Mumbai) during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over west coast and Gujarat region with heavy falls.
- Rain/thundershowers would continue at many places over northwest India.
- Decrease in rainfall activity over central and interior peninsular India.

<u>CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION</u> (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 4th Sept, 2012 there are 07 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

Assam

- ➤ River Brahmaputra at Numalighat, district Jorhat/Numaligarh, Assam is flowing at 85.32m against the danger level of 85.04m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Dhansiri (S) at Numaligarh, district Golaghat/Numaligarh, Assam is flowing at 78.18 m against the danger level of 77.42 m with Rising trend.

Bihar

- ➤ River Bagmati at Benibad, district Muzafferpur/Hayaghat, Bihar is flowing at 49.22m against the danger level of 48.68m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Kosi at Basua, district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.80 m against the danger level of 47.75m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Kosi at Baltara, district Khagaria/Choutham, Bihar is flowing at 33.92 m against the danger level of 33.85 m with Rising trend.

Uttar Pradesh

➤ River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge, district Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.28m against the danger level of 106.07m with Falling trend.

West Bengal

➤ River Ganga at Farakka, district Murshidabad/Farakka, West Bengal is flowing at 22.48m against the danger level of 22.25 m with Falling trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 4th Sept,</u> 2012.

❖ In Assam, 07 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 239 personnel (Kamrup-21, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-35, Dhubri-35, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-36 and Lakhimpur-35) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.

- ❖ In West Bengal, 04 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 107 personnel (Alipurdwar-25, Kurseong- 54, Mainaguri-28) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 96 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Delhi 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 22 personnel deployed in c/w monsoon session of Parliament house.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 118 personnel (Mujjafarpur-34, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-31, and Darbhanga-23) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
