Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 08.09.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall has occurred at most places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat, west Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, and Andaman & Nicobar Island; at many places over Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, east Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Odisha, Tamilnadu and Lakshadweep: at a few places over Chhattisgarh, Marathwada and north coastal Andhra Pradesh and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside northeastern states where weather remained mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (3 cm and above) recorded at 0830 hours IST of today were: Idar-23, Baripada-13, Mount Abu-11, Dharamshala-9, Dehradun, Barmer and Bharatpur-6 each, Mahabaleshwar and Mayabandar-7 each, Karwar, Udaipur, Chennai, Naliya and Deesa-5 each, Nagappattinam, Carnicobar, Shimla and Aligarh-4 each and Visahakhapatnam, Surat, Sambalpur, Honavar, Jodhpur, Tehri, Agathi, Mahuva, Bhuj, Katra, Sholapur, Medikeri, Agumbe, and Erinpura and Sawai Madhopur-3 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over west coast, Gujarat and decrease over Gujarat after 48 hours..
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Rajasthan, central & adjoining east India, Madhya Maharashtra, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and decrease over Rajasthan after 48 hours.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and west Uttar Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over east Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rayalaseema, Tamilnadu and interior Karnataka.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 19 Teams consisting of 604 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –04, West Bengal-04, Andhra Pradesh-01, Maharashtra-04, Gujarat -02 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over west coast, Gujarat and decrease over Gujarat after 48 hours.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Rajasthan, central & adjoining east India, Madhya Maharashtra, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and decrease over Rajasthan after 48 hours.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and west Uttar Pradesh.

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over east Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rayalaseema, Tamilnadu and interior Karnataka.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, south Rajasthan, Odisha and coastal Karnataka during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, east and adjoining central India, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over northwest states.

Moderate Flood Site

Gujarat

➤ River Narmada at Bharuch, district Bharuch/Bharuch, Gujarat is flowing at 8.20 m against the danger level of 7.31 m with Falling trend.

Uttar Pradesh

➤ River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge, district Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.10m against the danger level of 106.07m with Falling trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 8th Sept, 2012.</u>

- ❖ In Assam, 04 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 133 personnel (Kamrup-20, Dhemaji-42, Sonitpur-36 and Karimganj-35) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In West Bengal, 04 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 128 personnel (Alipurdwar-32, Kurseong- 66, Mainaguri-30) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 04 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 139 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Gujarat, 02 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 72 personnel in Surat deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 117 personnel (Mujjafarpur-32, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-31, and Darbhanga-24) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
