Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 17.09.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall has occurred at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at a many places over Jammu & Kashmir, east Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya; at a few places over Madhya Pradesh, Odisha and Kerala and at one or two places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, west Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Konkan and coastal & south interior Karnataka. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (2cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Maya Bander-9, Long Islands-7, Cherrapunji-5, Hardoi, Ghazipur, Baghdogra, Dibrugarh, Passighat and Churk-3 each and Gorakhpur, Patna, Kailashhar, Bilaspur, Khajuraho, Jamshedpur, Kolkata, Jharsuguda and Panambur-2each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over east Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Sub- Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and decrease over east Uttar Pradesh and Bihar afte4r 48 hours..
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Western Himalyan region and adjoining plains of northwest India, east India, west coast and Lakshadweep and decrease over northwest India after 48 hours.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over east Rajasthan, west Madhya Pradesh and north coastal Andhara Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

There are 12 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 17.09.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

12 Teams consisting of 358 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –03, Andhra Pradesh-01, Maharashtra-03, Uttarakhand-1 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over east Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and decrease over east Uttar Pradesh and Bihar afte4r 48 hours..
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Western Himalyan region and adjoining plains of northwest India, east India, west coast and Lakshadweep and decrease over northwest India after 48 hours.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over east Rajasthan, west Madhya Pradesh and north coastal Andhara Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

Weather Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at a few places over east Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and Andaman & Nicobar Islands with extremely heavy falls at one or two places over Bihar and sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during next 48 hours.
- **Heavy rainfall** would occur at one or two places over Jammu Division of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttrakhand, west Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand and Gangetic west Bengal during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over east India, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Considerable decrease in rainfall activity over parts of northwest and adjoining west and central India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

- ➤ River Jiabharali at Jiabharali (NTX), district Sonitpur/ Balipara, Assam is flowing at 77.15m against the danger level of 77.00m with Rising trend.

Bihar

- ➤ River Bagmati at Benibad, district Muzafferpur/Hayaghat, Bihar is flowing at 49.34 m against the danger level of 48.68 m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Kosi at Basua, district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 48.00 m against the danger level of 47.75m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Kosi at Baltara, district Khagria/Choutham, Bihar is flowing at 34.08 m against the danger level of 33.85m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Adhwara at Kamtaul district Darbhanga, Bihar is flowing at 50.39m against the danger level of 50.00m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Mahananda at Dhengraghat, district Purnia, Bihar is flowing at 35.89m against the danger level of 35.65m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Punpun at Sripalpur, district Patna/Sripalpur Bihar is flowing at 51.66 m against the danger level of 50.60m with Rising trend.

Uttar Pradesh

- ➤ River Ganga at Ballia, district Ballia, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 58.00m against the danger level of 57.62 m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge, district Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.97m against the danger level of 106.07 m with Steady trend.
- ➤ River Ghaghra at Ayodhya, district Faizabad/Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 92.88m against the danger level of 92.73 m with Rising trend.
- ➤ River Ghaghra at Turtipar, district Ballia/Balthara, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.02m against the danger level of 64.01 m with Rising trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 17th Sept, 2012.</u>

- ❖ In Assam, 03 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 96 personnel (Kamrup-19, Dhemaji-42 and Sonitpur-35) deployed in connection with flood rescue and relief operations.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 93 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Uttarakhand, 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 43 personnel in Rudarparyag deployed for rescue in c/w cloud brust.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 111 personnel (Mujjafarpur-31, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-29 and Darbhanga-21) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
