Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**
SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 21.09.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and Andaman & Nicobar islands; at a many places over interior Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Marathawada and Vidarbha and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside Punjab, Haryana, west Rajasthan, Karnataka, Kerala and Lakshadweep where weather remained mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (4 cm and above) recorded at 0830 hours IST of today are: Passighat-21, Dhubri-17, Dibrugarh, Tinsukhia and Angul-7 each, Koraput-6, Cherrapunji, Titlagarh-5 each, Paradip, Hut Bay and Majbat and Goalpara-4 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Nagaland Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at few places over Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, east Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, north Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra and Goa during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside west Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and west Uttar Pradesh where weather would be mainly dry.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There are 04 High flood situation & 20 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 21.09.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

16 Teams consisting of 472 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam -06, Andhra Pradesh-01, Maharashtra-03, Uttarakhand-1, Uttar Pradesh-01 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Nagaland Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at few places over Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, east Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, north Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra and Goa during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside west Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and west Uttar Pradesh where weather would be mainly dry.

Weather Warning

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** would occur at one or two places over Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 48 hours.
- **Heavy rainfall** would occur at one or two places over Sub-Himalayan, West Bengal & Sikkim during next 24 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over northeastern States and Andaman & Nicobar Islands
- Possibility of increase in rainfall activity over south peninsular India from 26th September onwards.
- Weather would be mainly dry over northwest India.

- River Brahmaputra at Numaligarh, district Golaghat/Numaligarh, Assam is flowing at 77.46 m against the danger level of 77.42 m with Rising trend.
- River Jiabharali at Jiabharali (NTX), district Sonitpur/ Ballpara, Assam is flowing at 77.05m against the danger level of 77.00m with Rising trend.
- River Bekii at Beki (NHX), district Barpeta/Sorbhog Assam is flowing at 45.27 m against the danger level of 45.10 m with Falling trend.
- River Manas at Manas (NTX), district Bongaigaon/Bijni, Assam is flowing at 48.54 m against the danger level of 48.42 m with Rising trend.

Bihar

- River Ganga at Patna (Gandhighat), district Patna, Bihar is flowing at 49.25 m against the danger level of 48.60 m with Falling trend.
- River Ganga at Hathidah, district Patna, Bihar is flowing at 42.15 m against the danger level of 41.76 m with Rising trend.
- River Ganga at Colgong, district Bhagalpur/Colgong, Bihar is flowing at 31.39 m against the danger level of 31.09 m with Rising trend.
- River Burhi Gandak at Khagaria, district Khagaria, Bihar is flowing at 36.26 m against the danger level of 36.58 m with Rising trend.
- River Bagmati at Benibad, district Muzafferpur/Hayaghat, Bihar is flowing at 49.26 m against the danger level of 48.68 m with Falling trend.
- River Adhwara at Kamtaul, district Darbhanga Kamtaul, Bihar is flowing at 50.55 m against the danger level of 50.00 m with Falling trend.
- River Kosi at Basua, district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.84m against the danger level of 47.75m with Steady trend.
- River Kosi at Kursela, district Katihar/Khursela, Bihar is flowing at 30.44m against the danger level of 30.00m with Rising trend.
- River Sone at Maner, district Patna/Maner, Bihar is flowing at 52.22 m against the danger level of 52.00m with Falling trend.
- River Punpun at Sripalpur, district Patna/Sripalpur Bihar is flowing at 51.92 m against the danger level of 50.60m with Falling trend.

Jharkhand

- River Ganga at Sahibganj, district Sahibganj, Jharkhand is flowing at 27.92m against the danger level of 27.25m with Rising trend.

- River Ganga at Ballia, district Ballia, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 58.22m against the danger level of 57.62 m with Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Ayodhya, district Faizabad/Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 93.35m against the danger level of 92.73 m with Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Turtipar, district Ballia/Balthara, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.80m against the danger level of 64.01m with Falling trend.

West Bengal

- River Ganga at Farakka , district Murshidabad, West Bengal is flowing at 23.04m against the danger level of 22.25 m with Rsing trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 21st Sept, 2012.

- ❖ In Assam, 05 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 183 personnel (Kamrup-49, Dhemaji-42, Sonitpur-35 and Tinsukia-57) deployed in connection with flood rescue and relief operations.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 95 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Uttarakhand, 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 43 personnel in Rudarparyag deployed for rescue in c/w cloud burst.
- ❖ In Uttar Pradesh, 01 team of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 24 personnel in Gonda deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 112 personnel (Mujjafarpur-31, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-29 and Darbhanga-21) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
