Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 29.08.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall has occurred at most places over West Coast, Madhya Maharashtra, south interior Karnataka, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands: at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Marathwada, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, north interior Karnataka and northeastern states; at a few places over Gujarat state, Gangetic West Bengal and Andhra Pradesh and at one or two places over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (4 cm and above) recorded at 0830 hours IST of today are: Silchar-9; Shirali-7; Delhi(Std)-6, Port Blair, Mangalore, Hirakud, Siliguri and Orai-6 each; Mahabateshwar, Bhira, Ratlam, Cooch Behar, Panambur, Ambala and Car nicobar-5 each; Dibrugarh, Ratnagiri, Harnai, Agathi, Cannur, Amini Divi, Karwar and Medikeri-4 each; Dahanur, Vengurla, Udgir, Delhi(Pim), Ajmer, Allapuzha, Nedumbessary, Gulbarga, Goa, Mumbai, Udaipur, Long Islands, Hut bay, Jagdalpur and Agra-3 each; Lumding, Rohtak, Karipur, Tadong, Gangtok, Nagpathtinam, Vellore, Alibag, Shimla and Malegaon-2 each..

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- The upper air cyclonic circulation over southwest Rajasthan and neighbourhood now lies over south Rajasthan and extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level tilting south-westwards with height.
- A fresh upper air cyclonic circulation lies over west central and adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- Another upper air cyclonic circulation lies over Assam and neighbourhood in lower level.
- The axis of monsoon trough at mean sea level passes through Jaisalmer, Kota, Guna, Umaria, Ambikapur, Balasore and thence south-eastwards to north Andaman sea.
- The off-shore trough from Maharashtra coast to Kerala coast persists.

<u>CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)</u>

There are 03 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 29.08.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 26 Teams consisting of 775 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –12, Andhra Pradesh–01, West Bengal-04, Maharashtra-03, Uttarakhand-01, Delhi-01 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- The upper air cyclonic circulation over southwest Rajasthan and neighbourhood now lies over south Rajasthan and extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height.
- A fresh upper air cyclonic circulation lies over west central and adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- Another upper air cyclonic circulation lies over Assam and neighbourhood in lower level.

- The axis of monsoon trough at mean sea level passes through Jaisalmer, Kota, Guna, Umaria, Ambikapur, Balasore and thence south-eastwards to north Andaman sea.
- The off-shore trough from Maharashtra coast to Kerala coast persists.

Weather Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over west coast, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 48 hours.
- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Uttarakhand, west Uttar Pradesh, Haryna, Delhi & Chandigarh during next 24 hours and over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Kerala, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rainfall would occur at most places over west coast and northeastern states with heavy to very heavy falls at one or two places.
- ♦ Rainfall would occur at many places over western Himalayan region, north Andhra Pradesh and Central India.

Moderate Flood Site

Assam

➤ River Dhansiri(s) at Numaligarhin district Golaghat/Numaligarh, Assam is flowing at 78.02m against the danger level of 77.42m with Rising trend.

East Uttar Pradesh

- ➤ River Ganga at Ballia in district Ballia, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 57.70m against the danger level of 57.62 m with Falling trend.
- ➤ River Ghaghra at Turtipar in district Ballia/Balthra, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.04m against the danger level of 64.01m with Rising trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 29th Aug, 2012.</u>

- ❖ In Assam, 12 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 386 personnel (Kamrup-22, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-35, Dhubri-35, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-71, Lakhimpur-35, Guwahati-27, Changsari-54, Barpeta-30,) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In West Bengal, 04 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 100 personnel (Siliguri- 48, Mainaguri- 27 and Jalpaiguri-25) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.

- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 96 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 110 personnel (Mujjafarpur-31, Supoul- 26, Gopalganj-30 and Darbhanga-23) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
- ❖ In Uttrakhand 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 46 personnel deployed in UttarKashi, for rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Delhi, 01team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 22 personnel deployed in connection with monsoon session of Parliament House.
