Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 31.08.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many places over Odisha, north Andhra Pradesh, coastal Karnataka, Kerala and Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, east Uttar Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, northeastern states, Saurashtra, Maharashtra and Lakshadweep and at one or two places over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (1 cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Aurangabad-8, Mahuva-6, Jagdalpur and Thrissur-4 each; Mangalore, Ramagundam, Nedumbassery, Valparai, Hamirpur, Seoni and Koraput-3 each; Vishakhapatnam, Diu, Cannur, Aminidivi, Alibag, Chandigarh, Angul, Portblair, Rewa, Amraoti and Kavarathi-2 each; Tuni, Bhubaneshwar, Chandbali, Shimla, Nasik, Mysore, Thiruvananthapuram, Kottayam, Aleppey, Agathi, Charrapunji, Mumbai, Harnai, Ahmadnagar, Titlagarh, Hut-bay, Kolkata, Satna, Mandla and Medikeri-1 each.

<u>Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)</u>

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over west coast, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Gujarat state, interior Karnataka, northeastern states and Sub-Himalayan west Bengal & Sikkim.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over north Andhra Pradesh, south Chhattisgarh and interior Maharashtra during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 21 Teams consisting of 625 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –08, West Bengal-04, Andhra Pradesh-01, Maharashtra-03, Delhi-01 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over west coast, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Gujarat state, interior Karnataka, northeastern states and Sub-Himalayan west Bengal & Sikkim.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over north Andhra Pradesh, south Chhattisgarh and interior Maharashtra during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.

Moderate Flood Site

Assam

➤ River Dhansiri(s) at Numaligarh, district Golaghat/Numaligarh, Assam is flowing at 78.35m against the danger level of 77.42m with Falling trend.

Bihar

➤ River Kosi at Basua, district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.79m against the danger level of 47.75m with Falling trend.

Uttar Pradesh

➤ River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge, district Barabanki,Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.25m against the danger level of 106.07m with Steady trend.

West Bengal

➤ River Ganga at Farakka, district Murshidabad/Farakkas, West Bengal is flowing at 22.40m against the danger level of 22.25 m with Steady trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 31st Aug, 2012.</u>

- ❖ In Assam, 08 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 273 personnel (Kamrup-20, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-35, Dhubri-35, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-71 and Lakhimpur-35) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In West Bengal, 04 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 102 personnel (Kurseong- 47, Mainaguri-30 and Jalpaiguri-25) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 96 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.

- ❖ In Delhi, 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 22 personnel deployed in connection with monsoon session of Parliament House.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 117 personnel (Mujjafarpur-34, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-30, and Darbhanga-23) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
