Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 26.09.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at a few places over Gujarat region and at one or two places over Assam, Odisha, southwest Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and north interior Karnataka. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (1cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were; Surat-4; Puri, Carnicobar, Indore, Ramagundam and Gulbarga-1 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over northeastern states, Sub-Himalayan, West Bengal & Sikkim and north Andhra Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Jammu & Kashmir, Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, south Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra & Goa, south Madhya Pradesh and south Gujarat region during next 24 hours.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over Karnataka, Kerala, Rayalaseema and Tamilnadu during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.
- Weather would be mainly dry over rest of the country.

- River Brahmaputra at Guwahati, district Kamrup/Guwahati, Assam is flowing at 50.74m against the danger level of 49.68m with Rising trend.
- River Brahmaputra at Goalpara, district-Goalpara, Assam is flowing at 36.77m against the danger level 36.27m with Rising trend.
- River Brahmaputra at Dhubri, district Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 29.68m against the danger level of 28.62m with Rising trend.
- River Subansiri at Badatighat, district Lakhimpur/Bihpuria, Assam is flowing at 82.58m against the danger level of 82.53m with Falling trend.
- River Dhansiri (S) at Numaligarh, District-Golaghat, Assam is flowing at 77.49m against the danger level of 77.42m with Falling trend.

<u>Bihar</u>

- River Ganga at Colgong/Kahalgaon, district Bhagalpur/Colgong, Bihar is flowing at 31.37 m against the danger level of 31.09 m with Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Darauli, district Siwan/Darauli, Bihar is flowing at 61.17m against the danger level of 60.82m with Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Gangpur Siswan district Siwan, Bihar is flowing at 57.41m against the danger level of 57.04 m with Falling trend.
- River Burhi Gandak at Khagaria, district Khagaria, Bihar is flowing at 37.14m against the danger level of 36.58m with Falling trend.
- River Kosi at Kursela, district Katihar/Khursela, Bihar is flowing at 30.58m against the danger level of 30.00m with Falling trend.

<u>Jharkhand</u>

River Ganga at Sahibganj, district Sahibganj, Jharkhand is flowing at 28.17m against the danger level of 27.25m with Steady trend.

<u>Uttar Pradesh</u>

River Ghaghra at Turtipar, district Ballia/Balthara, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.37m against the danger level of 64.01m with Falling trend.

West Bengal

River Ganga at Farakka, district Murshidabad, West Bengal is flowing at 23.32m against the danger level of 22.25m with Falling trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 26th Sept, 2012.

- In Assam, 08 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 235 personnel (Kamrup(02 teams)-50, Dhemaji-35, Sonitpur(02 teams)-64, Tinsukia (03 teams)-86) deployed in connection with flood rescue and relief operations.
- In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 95 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 110 personnel (Mujjafarpur-30, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-27 and Darbhanga-23) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
