SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 06.08.2014

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

The southwest monsoon has been vigorous over Madhya Pradesh & south interior Karnataka and active over Chhattisgarh & coastal Karnataka.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

Rain/thundershowers has occurred at most places over Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, coastal Karnataka, Kerala and Andaman & Nicobar islands; at many places over east Rajasthan, Gujarat region, West Bengal & Sikkim, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Lakshadweep; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, Northeastern States, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, interior Karnataka, Tamilnadu and Telangana; at isolated places over Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Bihar and Jharkhand. Weather remained mainly dry/dry over rest parts of the country. The amounts of rainfall (7 cm or more) recorded at 0830 IST of today are: Damoh and Umaria-17 each; Sagar-13; Dibrugarh and Tikamgarh-12 each; Mahabaleshwar, Agra, Guna, Rajgarh and Khajuraho-11 each; Pasighat, Karwar and Honawar-10 each; Cannur and Narsinghpur -9 each; Long Island and Karipur-8 each; Cherrapunji, Alibagh, Bhira, Kozhikode and Pendra Road-7 each.

DISASTER REPORTED

Himachal Pradesh:-

Update upto 1700 hrs dated 6.08.2014 regarding the missing 01 Guide and 24 Students in flash flood, Mandi (H.P). 24 dead bodies of students have been retrieved. Rescue operation is continues to retrieve dead body of missing guide.

Maharashtra

Update on landslide in Malin Village Tehsil- Ambegaon, Distt. Pune, Maharashtra on 30.07.2014 at about 0830 hrs due to heavy rain. The place is situated approx. 120 Kms from Pune. As per the reports received from NDRF, 153 human dead bodies, 54 cattles dead body recovered from the debris and 8 injured persons rescued. Further property recovered sum of Rs. 5,00,000/- (approx.) including Gold & Silver and cash a sum of Rs.7,000/- already been handed over to Police Station Ghodegaon, Distt. Pune, Maharashtra.

09 Teams of NDRF consisting 378 rescuers alongwith 06 Nos Dog Squad carrying executive search Ops.

State Government also geared up local administration and opened Control Rooms at Gode Gam, Manchar, for rescue operation. The rescue operations are going on in the area. Medical Units, Food packets, Flood lights are being provided. Rescue and relief operations are continued.

Bihar

Flood threat in Bihar due to pooled up water of Kosi River: 15 NDRF teams and 05 SDRF teams have been deployed in various districts of Bihar. In addition, 05 columns of Army have also been deployed in Supaul(02), Saharsa(02), & Madhepura(01). 163 relief camps have been established. 1,43,073 People have been evacuated from danger zone. Additional Mobile medical camps with 33 ambulances and 127 Doctors are deputed for providing medical aid in the districts.

As per reports received from Spl Secretary, Disaster Management Department, Bihar, in view of recession in Kosi River, District Magistrates of flood affected districts of Bihar have been asked to stop the evacuation of people and cattle to relief camps and make arrangement for safe return to their houses. NDRF/SDRF teams will remain deployed till further orders. Relief camps and all arrangements in relief camp to remain as it is so that if situation arises facilities may be utilized.

UTTAR PRADESH

Update regarding boat capsized in river Ganga in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh on 5/8/2014. As reported by NDRF Control Room 23 persons rescued, 02 dead bodies retrieved and 17 persons are still missing. Rescue operation continues.

ODISHA

More than 12.50 lakh cusec of water is expected to pass through Mundali near Cuttack in Mahanadi River System. Baitarani is flowing above danger mark both at Anandpur and Akhuapada gauge station. Although the flood water receding, the river is likely to increase for more time in the downstream and inundate the villages.

21 districts which include 515 villages have been affected. 71 villages are marooned. So far 26 persons lost their lives while 47360 persons have been evacuated from flood affected districts in various relief camps.
