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2. SITUATION ASSESSMENT/FORECAST

- Hydro and Agro Institute forecasted for the next 12 hours, heavy rainfall in upper northeastern in Nong kai, Bung Kan, Nakhon Panom on dated 18 September. The monsoon trough lies across the lower northern. Keep close watch weather forecast at the central and lower northeastern part for flood.
- Royal Irrigation Department (RID): Water situation is still required close watch especially in the lower Chao Phraya Basin. The followings are the water situation overview;

River Basins

- Ping Basin: Inundation remains at Sun Kamphang of Chiang mai Province. Inundation is decreasing in Meuang Distrcit of Lumphun Province, while in Bunphotphisai District of Nakhon Sawan Province is decreasing.
- Yom Basin: Inundation remains in Si Samrong District of Sukhothai Province, Bang Rakum District of Phitsanulok Province and 3 districts (Sam Ngam, Pho Thale, and Pho Prathap Chang) of Phichit Province.
- Nan Basin: Inundation remains at Phitsanulok (Nakhon Thai, and Meuang District). Nakhon Sawan (Chum Sang District) and Phitsanulok (Wang Thong District) is likely to increase.
- Pasak Basin: Inundation in Wichian Buri District of Petchabun province is increasing.
- Eastern River Basin: Inundation in Muang and Kabinburi District of Prachinburi Province is increasing.
- Shi Basin: Inundation is increasing in Chaiyaphum province (Khwao District), Roi-Et province (Jung han Province), Yasothorn Province (Meuang and Maha Chanachai District), and Nong Bua Lumphu Province (Meuang district).
- Mun Basin: Inundation is increasing in Nakhon Ratchasima (Choke Chai, and Phimai District), Roi-Et (Suvannabhum district), and Si Saket Province (Payuha, Kantararom and Huay Taptan District). Inundation is decreasing in Ubon Ratchathani (Muang, Trakan Pheutphon, and Dech Udom District),
- Lower Chao Phraya Basin: Water level is increasing. Inundation was reported in lowlands of Uthaithani, Chainat, Singburi, Ang Thong, Suphanburi, Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya, Pathumthani, and Nonthaburi Province.
- Mae Khong Basin: the inundation is reported in Muang District of Udon Thani and Ban Muang District of Sakon Nakorn Province.
 Major Dams
 - Bhumibol Dam ; it reached 87 Percent of retention capacity.
 - Sirikit Dam ; it reached 96 Percent of retention capacity.
 - Kwae Noi Dam; it reached 102 Percent of retention capacity.
 - Pasak Dam; it reached 95 Percent of retention capacity.
- Bangkok Metropolitan Administrative (BMA) The highest water level in the river is 1.68 m. at 20.30 hr. The highest sea level rise is expected on 17 September 2011, at 20.50 hr. No flood threat to BMA is reported. Special attention should be made at the eastern side of BMA, the outer flood prevention areas, including Meenburi, Nong Jok, and Lad Krabang District. 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3. WARNING AND ADVISORY MESSAGE

Royal Irrigation Department issued flood warning of 13 September at 6.00 p.m. at the lower Chao Praya River.
 Regarding the heavy rain in the northern part at the ending of Bhumibol Dam in Tak, Kampangpetch and Petchabun Province during September 10-11, 2011, it caused water level in Ping River and branches increasing rapidly. It will affected water level in Nakhon Sawan Province to increase to 1 meter higher. Therefore, it is expected the highest releasing level during 19-20 September, 2011 with comparison to 2010 at the rear of Chao Phraya Dam in Chainart, Sing Buri, Ang Thong, Phra Nakorn Si Ayutthaya, Pathumthani and Bangkok for these following period.

4. THE 2P2R MEASURES

PREPARATION

- In the improved areas from flood, the concerned agencies need to accelerate to survey damage assessment to farmland, fisheries, livestock and budget compensation (5,000 baht per family) together with the infrastructure rehabilitation.
- The Provincial, District and Local Agencies will comply with the followings order;
 - Maintain quality of survival kits such as drinking water to keep it away from sunlight
 - Provide victim assistance equitable and fair
 - Accelerate to compensate budget
 - Retrofit sand bag construction according to engineering method to resist flood pressure

RESPONSE

- The integrated donation center among concerned agencies at the provincial, district and local level to provide equitable victim assistance and disseminate to the public in order to prevent repetitive distribution survival kits.
- Ministry of Public Health ordered 14 hospitals namely; Bang Rakum, Tapanhin, Inburi, Singburi, Ang Thong, Uthai Thani, Bang Sai, Bang Ban, Pak Hai, Bang Pa In, Pra Nung Khao, Bang Yai, Bang Krauy, Chao Phraya Yommaraj Hospital, to create sand bag barriers to prevent flooding. Additionally, they require the support from provinces, districts, locals to support them.
- Due to the long term flood in Inburi Hospital in Singburi Province, liquid oxygen for respirator will be run out by 7 days. Patients with respirator need to be transferred to nearby hospital so as to spare the respirators for emergency cases.
