Flood Situation in Southern Thailand Issue 2/2011 (AS of 1 April 2011)

I. Weather condition:

Heavy rainfall and thunderstorm remains in Chumporn, Ranong, Phuket, PangNga, Suratthani, Nakorn Sri Thammarat, Phattalung, Trang, Krabi, and Satun. Wind and wave in the Gulf of Thailand and Andaman are lowering.

II. Affected Areas:

Eight provinces (Nakorn Sri Thammarat, Phattalung, Suratthani, Trang, Chumporn, Songkla, Krabi, and PangNga), 87 districts, 568 Sub-districts, 4,615 villages, 294,097 households, and 999,867 people. Twenty-one people are identified dead.
