# <u>Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction 2003</u> --- Living with Risk: Towards Disaster Resilient Societies ---



The Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction 2003 (the 5th ADRC International Meeting and ISDR Asian Meeting) was held in Kobe, Japan from the 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> of January 2003, co-hosted by the UN/ISDR, the Cabinet Office of Japan, Hyogo Prefecture, ADRC, and the Disaster Reduction Alliance. The conference gathered policy representatives, experts in disaster and risk management from 24 countries in Asia and other parts of the world, and representatives of 26 international and regional organizations.

The aim of the conference was: a) to understand the achievements and challenges in disaster reduction in Asia, b) to develop a paradigm for regional and international cooperation, and c) to build disaster reduction capacity in the Asian region and propose guidelines for its improvement in review of the Yokohama Strategy and Plan of Action for a Safer World. Throughout the conference the participants engaged in frank and constructive discussion.

#### < Recommendations of the Conference>

In order to respond to trends and address challenges emerging in the  $21^{\text{st}}$  Century with regard to urban disasters, climate change, and climate related disasters, and to promote cooperation between the various sectors in the field of disaster management, it is necessary to build a framework of international cooperation in the following areas:

- Urban vulnerability and disasters
- 2) Response to climate change
- Multi-disciplinary and inter-sectoral cooperation to address emerging challenges
- 4) Enhancement of information management capacity

ADRC also started a cooperative project, "Human Resources Development on Disaster Management," with Laos PDR. In Laos, the first workshop will start on the  $4^{th}$  of February.

ADRC would like to contribute to further capacity building in its member countries through these projects.
