Recent Natural Disasters in Asia:

Floods and Landslides in India

The heavy rains, which started on 24 July 2005, caused severe floods in the state of Maharashtra and in the coastal region of Goa, India. On 4 August 2005, the death toll amounted to 1,203 in the state of Maharashtra, of which Mumbai is the capital. More than 94cm of rain fell in Mumbai in one day, a record in India's history, causing important havoc in the city. In the village of Juigaon, situated 150 km south of Mumbai, it was estimated that over 100 people had lost their lives in a mudslide on 26 July. Large scale rescue operations took place in the landslide affected district and in other parts of the state.

Concerning the national response, the Indian Government called in the Army, the Navy and Air Forces in order to carry out search and rescue operations. Wherever road access was impossible, the Indian Air Force carried out relief material dropping operations.

I was responsible for promoting human resource development for disaster management, as well as coordinating the Disaster Reduction Alliance (DRA) composed of 13 organizations in the Kobe area, including ADRC.

Using my personal, sad experience of the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake in 1995, my experience of the infrastructure reconstruction as a civil engineer of the Hyogo Prefecture and the global human network that I have built up throughout ADRC and DRI activities, my wish is to make further contributions to disaster risk reduction worldwide.
