JAXA and ADRC Announce Launch of "Sentinel Asia"


In this disaster prone-world, significant attention is being given to the use of satellites as communication tools for ascertaining the situation of areas affected by disasters and for connecting those areas with disaster management agencies during major disasters.

The Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) and the Asian Disaster Reduction Center (ADRC) announced on 24 October 2006 the launch of Sentinel Asia, a voluntary initiative for establishing a Disaster Management Support System for the Asia-Pacific Region led by the Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum (APRSAF).

Sentinel Asia is being established on a voluntary and best-efforts basis, and is aimed at (1) creating a society that places the highest priority on human safety using information-communication technologies and space technologies, (2) improving disaster preparedness, and the speed and accuracy of early warning systems, and (3) minimizing the number of victims and the social and economic losses caused by natural disasters.

The space agencies of the Sentinel Asia Joint Project Team (JPT) and ADRC member countries are eligible to request disaster observation satellite data and images obtained by ALOS (Advanced Land Observing Satellite, JAXA) and other available resources after major disasters. The observation results will be open to the public through the Internet and the raw data can be provided to the organizations that request it.

The overall flow of how Sentinel Asia works is illustrated as follows.

Scheduled during the time frame of the 2nd anniversary of the World Conference on Disaster Reduction (WCDR) and the Indian Ocean Tsunami, and the 12th anniversary of the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake that occurred in 1995, the Forum aims to help participants learn from the major disasters of the past and to contribute to the implementation of the HFA.
