

Damage by the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake January 17, 1995

Size: Magnitude 7.3 on the Richter scale

Maximum Earthquake Intensity: 7

Epicenter: Southern Part of Hyogo (Northern Part of Awaji Island)

No. of Casualties : 6,433

Amount of Damage : JY 9.9 Trillion


Maximum No. of Evacuees: 316,678

1,153




