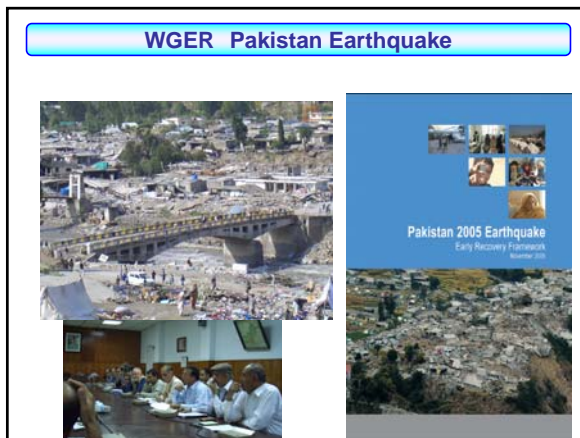

1 Background

- > Various research reports on good practice, lessons learned, case studies on recovery already exist.
- > They are mostly summarized and analyzed by each major disaster
- > However, when experts on recovery visit disaster affected countries, they are frequently asked to provide them with “cross-disaster” knowledge support on topical thematic lines which are comprehensive and general (not sectoral)

2 Project Objectives

Quickly & effectively provide the **key persons** in charge of planning and implementing the recovery activities of **national and local governments** with useful, **important and on-target knowledge** for post disaster recovery through **cross-disaster analysis** of lessons learned from the recovery experiences from recent major disasters

3 Methodologies

1) Collect "Good Practices" and "Lessons learned" of post-dis, rec.

- 1 Developed a preliminary database linking to around 60 data sources on good practices, lessons, case studies mainly on post disaster recovery using the IRP network.
- 2 Publish above list of data sources on the IRP web with hyper-link to each data owner for easy access

8.2	Above implications for (a) designing of programmes, (b) institutional structures, (c) coordination between government and international funders, and (d) transparency and corruption issues
