Taking into consideration the importance of this topic, this Asian forum is of great interest – amongst the participants there will be 126 heads and experts from 36 international organizations, agencies dealing with emergency and disaster issues in Asian countries, non-governmental and scientific organizations and private companies from 31 countries.

This international event important for the Asian region is held in Kazakhstan and in Central Asia in whole for the first time.

Representative of the Administration of the President and Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan also take part in the work of this rather important for Kazakhstan international event.
