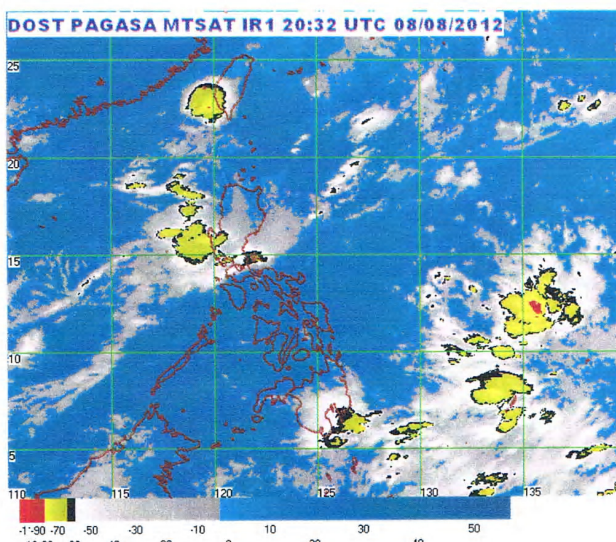

I. WEATHER SITUATION: (As of 5:00 AM, 09 August 2012)

SYNOPSIS: Southwest Monsoon affecting Luzon

FORECAST: Luzon will experience occasional rains becoming frequent over the western section which may trigger flashfloods and landslides. Mindanao will have mostly cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms while Visayas will be partly cloudy to at times cloudy with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from southwest will prevail over Luzon and Western Visayas and the coastal waters along these areas will be moderate to rough. Elsewhere, winds will be light to moderate coming from the south to southwest with slight to moderate seas.



RAINFALL WARNING SIGNAL: Yellow Warning as of 3:30 AM, 9 August 2012

Intense rainfall (16.2mm/hr) was observed over Quezon City, Moderate to Heavy rainfall (2.5-7.5 mm/hr) was observed over Caloocan, Novaliches, Pasay, Manila, Pasig & Marikina while Light to Moderate rainfall (1.0-7.0 mm/hr) over the rest of Metro Manila.

Intermittent Light to occasionally Moderate (2.5- 7.5mm/hr) rains is expected to affect Metro Manila within 3 hours.

People are advised to **MONITOR** the weather condition and **WATCH OUT** for the next warning. **POSSIBLE FLOODING** in low-lying areas and those located near the river channels.

II. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. EFFECTS

1. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)

- A total of 3 incidents were monitored as of 09 August 2012, 6:00AM: One (1) Landslide, one (1) Drowning and one (1) Vehicular accident.

2. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

- Based on the report of DSWD as of **6:00 AM, 09 August 2012**, the total number of population affected in **1,529 Barangays / 128 Municipalities / 30 Cities in 16 Provinces** of Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, VI and NCR is: **454,093 families / 1,953,481 persons**
- Of the above total affected, **111,079 families/ 538,445 persons** are currently served inside and outside evacuation centers

Inside **488** Evacuation Centers (ECs)

61,895 families / 292,809 persons

Outside ECs (relatives/friends)

49,184 families / 245,636 persons

3. CASUALTIES (TAB C)

- A total of **19 persons were reported dead**: of whom **nine (9)** were victims of a landslide incident in Lower Bayanihan, Brgy Commonwealth, Quezon City, **eight (8)** died due to drowning and **two (2)** due to electrocution.
- A total of four (**4**) persons were injured of whom were victims of the landslide incident in Brgy. Commonwealth, Quezon City.
- A total of **three (3) persons are still missing** while **three (3)** were rescued.

4. STATUS OF LIFELINES

1. Condition of Roads and Bridges (TAB D)

- As of **6:00 AM, 09 August 2012**, a total of **154** roads and **4** Bridges are not passable to all types of vehicles in **Regions I, II, III, IV-A, VI, CAR and NCR** due to flooding. **Most of the reported non-passable ways are from NCR.**

2. Status of Dams and Waterways (As of 7:00 PM, 08 August 2012)

- Angat and Ipo in Bulacan, La Mesa in Quezon City, Ambulao and Binga in Benguet, San Roque in Pangasinan and Pantabangan in Nueva Ecija have already reached their critical levels; hence, they are closely monitored.

- Water releases from the critical dams is expected to affect the following areas: San Manuel, San Nicolas, Tayug, Sta Maria, Asingan, Villasis, Alcala, Bautista, Rosales and Bayambang in Pangasinan; Ramon in Isabela San Mateo, Rizal; Aurora, Cabanatuan, Luna, Reina Mercedes, Burgos, Naguilian and Gamu; and the low lying areas along Angat river from Norzagaray and Hgonoy;
- All residents living in the areas near the Ipo, Ambuklao, Binga, San Roque and Magat dams are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream and those near the La Mesa dam are advised to be alert for the overflow of water in La Mesa Dam.
- As of 2:37 AM, 9 August 2012, the water level of Marikina River reached an alarming state of 19.8 m. Forced evacuation was implemented to all residents.**

F. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB E)

- A total of **3,035** houses were damaged in Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B and VI: **358 totally** and **2,677 partially** damaged.

G. FLOODED AREAS (TAB F)

- **A total of 89 Cities/Municipalities from NCR, Regions I, III, and IV-A have severe floodings. Most of the reported areas are from Region IV-A (21 Municipalities) and NCR (15 Cities and 1 Municipality).**

III. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

A. CONDUCT OF EMERGENCY CABINET MEETING

- The NDRRMC conducted an Emergency Meeting with His Excellency President Benigno Aquino III at 10:00 AM, 7 August 2012 at the NDRRMC Conference Room, attended by DSWD, DILG, DOST (PAGASA), MMDA, DPWH, DOH, and Dep Ed, AFP, PNP, BFP, PCG, other agencies and print / broadcast media. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities
- The DOST (PAGASA), DSWD, DPWH, MMDA and DOH presented their reports based on their respective mandates
- The President raised some specific issues that need to be addressed by the concerned agencies. Likewise provided general guidance to the response and relief agencies to require the LGUs concerned to go around their respective areas through the Brgy Captains and provide necessary assistance whenever necessary
- President's instructions to the agencies were the following: DSWD to find a place where they can put tents as additional evacuation centers; DOH to initiate the provision of water for those who depend on deep wells and how to address flooding in hospitals; DILG to identify all inundated /flooded Barangays in Marikina City affected by SW Monsoon, require all LGUs to go around their areas through the barangay captains; and check floodings in Tarlac and Northern Luzon (La Union, Pangasinan and Ilocos; DOST to fast track the preparation of hazard map of Luzon. DPWH to study the long term solution for Laguna Lake
- **On 8 August, 2012, His Excellency President Benigno Aquino III, DND Secretary and NDRRMC Chairperson Voltaire Gazmin, MMDA Chairperson Francis Tolentino and Muntinlupa City Mayor Aldrin San Pedro personally inspected the Tunasan Elementary School in Brgy Tunasan, Muntinlupa City to assess the situation of the evacuees.**
- **The President then proceeded to the NDRRMOC for a short briefing with the NDRRMC TWG and discussed the current weather situation and forecast, roads accessibility and response measures being implemented.**

B. RELIEF AND RECOVERY OPERATIONS

DSWD

- As of 6:00 AM, 08 August 2012, the estimated cost of relief assistance provided to the disaster victims so far amounted to ₱p7,934,820.00 from the combined resources of: LGUs) (₱p3,144,033.00, NGOs ₱p 770,000.00 and DSWD) ₱p4,050,787.00
- Prepositioned standby funds and relief supplies worth PhP36,555,006.38 in all DSWD-FOs along the SW monsoon –affected areas: Standby Funds (PhP4.42 M) and relief supplies (PhP32.14 M)
- DROMIC is closely coordinating with DSWD-FOs concerned for any significant updates related to SW monsoon

DOH HEMS:

- **DOH-HEMS conducted rapid assessment and reported that Amang Rodriguez Memorial Medical Center, Dr. Jose Fabella Hospital, Dr. Jose R. Rodriguez Memorial Hospital, Dr. Jose Reyes Memorial Medical Center, East Avenue Medical Center, Research Institute for Tropical Medicines, San Lazaro Hospital, Tondo Medical Center, and San Lazaro Ruiz Woman's Hospital were flooded.**
- Closely monitors the status of health services, offices and personnel at all levels; strengthen advisory and health promotion campaign on the preventive measures of Leptospirosis case and other food and water borne related diseases; and released assorted drugs and medicines and rubber boots to CHDs.
- CHDs I, III, IV-A,, IV-B, CAR and NCR provided assorted drugs and medicines to the LGUs concerned.
- **Raised Code Blue Alert and activated operation center and medical response team on 24 hours duty.**

Dep ED

- Reported that 51 schools so far are being utilized as evacuation centers; mobilized teachers to conduct classes in QC; and prepare contingency plan (1-2 hr additional for regular classes) to complete 180 days mandatory or make up classes.

DPWH

- Rechanneling /diverting of water ways of the two bridges and filling of embankment over cut –off approach is ongoing, utilizing one (1) unit bulldozer and one (10 unit backhoe, three (30 dump trucks of the local government units and one (1) unit pay loader from private firm

DILG

- Provided assistance by search and rescue (SAR) and evacuation in the municipalities of Batangas namely: Calaca, Calatagan, Lemery, Lian, Taal, Tuy, Bauan, San Luis, Agoncillo, Alitagtag, Cuenca, Laurel, Malvar, San Nicolas, Sta Teresita, Talisay, Tanauan City
- Provincial Engineering Office mobilized heavy equipment (loader, backhoe and dumptrucks) to augment in the clearing operations in the affected barangays of Lemery.
- Issued a memorandum addressed to all DILG Provincial/City Directors for the reactivation of the Local Price Coordinating Councils to ensure that all LCE's adopt measures to address hoarding and exorbitant price increases of essential/prime commodities.**

C. COST OF ASSISTANCE (TAB G)

- A total amount of **₱ 126,655,118.38** worth of relief assistance was provided to the affected families. The **Local Government Units (LGUs)** provided **₱ 5,313,858.20**, **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** provisioned **₱ 948,400.00**, **Department of Health granted ₱ 982,220.58**, while the **Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)** allocated **₱ 119,410,639.60**.
- NCR received the biggest allocation based on the extent of damages in the aforementioned region.**

D. SEARCH AND RESCUE (SAR) OPERATIONS

- SAR operations were effected through the concerted efforts of the SAR units of AFP, PCG and PNP and around **9,250** personnel, **98** vehicles and **247** sea crafts were mobilized to various areas in Metro Manila

ACTIONS TAKEN
As of 09 August 2012, 6:00 AM

A. NATIONAL

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** was upgraded from BLUE ALERT to RED ALERT STATUS as of 4:45 AM, 07 August 2012 and is continuously monitoring and disseminating 24 hour Public Weather Forecast, Severe Weather Bulletin, Gale Warning, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDRs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial to the municipal levels.
- Conducted Emergency meeting with the President Benigno Simeon Cojuangco Aquino III and was presided by Sec. Voltaire Gazmin, Chairperson of NDRRMC. It was attended by the Secretaries from different agencies namely: **PAGASA, DOST, DOTC, MMDA, DSWD, DILG, DOH, DPWH, DepEd, AFP, PNP and PCG**. The meeting focused on the action plan on damage assessment, asset mobilization, Search and Rescue (SAR), relief allocation and distribution to augment the LGUs and affected communities.
- Based on the recommendation of PAGASA and NDRRMC, the Office of the President issued MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 33 suspending work in government offices and classes in college level in National Capital Region and the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Bulacan, Laguna, Cavite and Rizal today, 07 August 2012, with the exception of those agencies whose functions involved the delivery of basic and health services, preparedness and response to disasters and calamities, and/or the performance of other vital public services.
- **DOH:**
 - **CHD III** conducted assessment on evacuation centers in Calumpit and Malolos City, Bulacan providing ₱ 50,000.00 worth of drugs and medicines to Provincial Health Team Office.
 - **DOH IV-A** provided ₱ 350,000 worth of different medicines and ₱ 100,000 worth of dextrochlorpheniramine capsules and prophylaxis to evacuation centers by field office to anticipate the influx of diseases especially Leptospirosis.
- **PRC Rizal Chapter** conducted relief operations in San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal
- **AFP:**
 - **161 Battalion** deployed 1 squad from Headquarters Company to Tanay, Rizal
 - **12 Disaster Response Unit (DRU) Charlie Company** conducted relief operations and facilitated evacuation of civilians trapped in deeply flooded areas in San Mateo, Rizal
 - **SOLCOM Commander** advised all operating units to coordinate to the LDRRMCs in their respective AORs and be prepared to assist in their operations as need arises.
 - **AFP RESCOM NHQ** assisted in the evacuation on Gen. Trias and Bacoar, Cavite.
 - **RESCOM** deployed fifty (50) raincoats and twenty six (26) boots.
 - **703rd Brigade** with one (1) platoon, two (2) KM450 and NHR truck was stationed at OCDR III for possible deployment and easy coordination of possible augmentation to flood affected areas.

- **LGU Roxas** placed their Operation Center on alert status and continuously monitoring the status of San Rafael dike.
- **Calapan City, Mindoro Public Safety Department** conducted ocular inspection and monitored the affected areas. Deployed personnel and prepositioned rescue equipment for possible SAR operations.

RDRRMC V

- Conducted RDRRMC Response Committee Meeting attended by representative from different agencies. Discussed preparations for the deployment of 1 water purifier, WATSAN and SAR teams to NCR for community assistance.
- **RDRRMC Bicol** sent a contingent of Team OCD5-Albay composed of WASAR teams from the naval Forces southern Luzon (NAVFORSOL), Tactical Operations Group 5 (TOG)-PAF and the BFP5 together with the Water Sanitation (WATSAN) team equipped with Water Filtration System. The team which is headed by the Deputy Commander of NAVFORSOL as the Task Force Head, proceeded to the Flood Control Information Center (FCIC), MMDRRMC for the coordinating instructions.

RDRRMC VI

- **PDRRMC Aklan, PDRRMC Antique and PDRRMC Iloilo** was placed on alert status to monitor the situation in their AOR particularly the landslide prone area.

RDRRMC NCR

- **MMDRRMC** conducted a meeting presided by Chairman Francis Tolentino and was attended by representatives from member agencies. Advance Command Posts (ACP) were initiated in strategic locations to provide assistance to the identified areas. The locations of the ACP are as follows: Marikina, Malabon, South (Alabang), Manila, Orense and in Quezon City.
- **CDRRMCC Muntinlupa built temporary footbridges at the affected areas near Laguna Lake.**
- **OCD-NCR** monitored landslide in Brgy Commonwealth, Quezon City.
- **QC DPOS** deployed Rescue Team with rubber boat to the following areas: Brgy Damayan Lagi, Brgy Sto Domingo, Brgy Damayan District I, Roxas District and Brgy Apolonio Samson.
- **Parañaque Rescue** dispatched two (2) dump trucks for the stranded passengers in Evacom and SM in San Dionisio, Parañaque. Deployed one (1) rubber boat, one (1) dump truck and rescue personnel in Brgy San Isidro to evacuate families from the creek side to the Brgy Hall.
- **Pasay City** deployed two (2) rubber boats with rescue personnel to assist rescue operations.
- **Coordinated the request of DSWD-NCR of four (4) units of 6x6 vehicles to conduct relief assistance with President Benigno Aquino III in the National Capital Region affected by Southwest Monsoon.**

RDRRMC CAR

- **PDRRMC Benguet** ordered pre-emptive evacuation to high risk areas. Mining Operation of small scale miners is still suspended.
