Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**
SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 10.08.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over coastal Karnataka; at many places over west Uttar Pradesh, south interior Karnataka and Kerala; at a few places over Himachal Pradesh, east Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Gujarat region, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and at one or two places over Uttarakhand, Haryana, west Rajasthan, Bihar, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Mizoram, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Andhra Pradesh, north interior Karnataka and Tamilnadu. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (3 cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Moradabad-10, Agumbe-9, Hamirpur and Kota-6 each, Bareilly, Banda, Ranchi, Shirali and Honavar-5 each, Ambala, Mahabaleshwar and Tondi-4 each and Aligarh, Gwalior, Tikamgarh, Shivpuri, Surat and Bulsar-3 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, east Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal & Sikkim and Odisha.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Northeastern States, west coast and Gujarat region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over rest parts of the country outside Punjab, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch and Tamilnadu where it would be at one or two places.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There is 02 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 10.08.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

- 28 Teams consisting of 894 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –15, Andhra Pradesh – 01, West Bengal-02, Maharashtra-03, Kerala-01, Uttarakhand-01, Delhi-1 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, east Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal & Sikkim and Odisha.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Northeastern States, west coast and Gujarat region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over rest parts of the country outside Punjab, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch and Tamilnadu where it would be at one or two places.

Weather Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over coastal Karnataka during next 48 hours.
- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh and east Rajasthan during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rainfall would occur at many places over Western Himalayan Region, Uttar Pradesh, south Rajasthan, Gujarat, west coast, east and northeast India.
- Rain/Thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the Country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 10th Aug, 2012, 02 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

West Bengal

- River Ganga at Farakka in Distt-Murshidabad, West Bengal is flowing at 22.30 m against the danger level of 22.25 m with Rising trend.

Uttar Pradesh

- River Ghaghra at Turtipar in Distt-Ballia/Balthra, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.21m against the danger level of 64.01m with Falling trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 10th Aug, 2012.

- ❖ In Assam, 15 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 495 personnel (Kamrup-21, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-34, Dhubri-66, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-111, Jorhat-32, Nagaon-30, Barpeta-30, Silchar-30, Jalpaiguri-61) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In West Bengal, 2 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 58 personnel (Siliguri- 58) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 105 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 116 personnel (Mujjafarpur-35, Supoul- 29, Gopalganj-33, and Dharbhanga-19) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
- ❖ In Delhi 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 22 personnel deployed at Parliament House in connection with monsoon session of Parliament House.
- ❖ In Kerala 01 team of 4th Bn NDRF consisting of 33 personnel deployed in Kannur for emergency response due to .heavy rain and landslide.

- ❖ In Uttrakhand 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 50 personnel deployed in UttarKashi, for rescue and relief operation.
