SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 19.08.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many places over Uttarakhand, Gangetic, West Bengal, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, east Madhya Pradesh and west places coast; at a few over Himachal Pradesh, east Uttar Pradesh, south interior Karnataka, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and isolated places over rest country outside west Rajasthan, Rayalaseema, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Manipur where weather remained mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (1cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Honavar and Bhawanipatna-6 each, Jalpaiguri and Dehradun-5 each. Katra. Mahabaleshwar. Titlagarh and Hamirpur(U.P.)-4 each, Lucknow, Mana and Angul-3 each, Jagdalpur, Durg, Phulbani and Agumbe-2 each and Ramagundam, Satna, Bhubaneshwar, Karwar, Mangalore, Kozhikode. Pachmarhi. Vallabh Vidhva Nagar. Kolkata. Raipur. Tikamgarh, Umaria, Fursatguni, Baripada and Kanpur-1 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana and Delhi.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Madhya Pradesh, west coast and northeastern states.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, Telangana, Marathawada and Madhya Maharashtra during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Uttar Pradesh and east India during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

There are 02 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 19.08.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

➤ 26 Teams consisting of 828 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –13, Andhra Pradesh–01, West Bengal-04, Maharashtra-03, Uttarakhand-01 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana and Delhi.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Madhya Pradesh, west coast and northeastern states.

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, Telangana, Marathawada and Madhya Maharashtra during next 24 hours and decrease thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Uttar Pradesh and east India during next 48 hours and increase thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

Weather Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Jammu division of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during next 72 hours.
- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Madhya Pradesh during next 48 hours and over Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha during next 24 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rainfall would occur at many places over northwest India.
- Rainfall activity would occur at many places over west coast, central, east and northeast India.

Moderate Flood Site

<u>Bihar</u>

➤ River PunPun at Sripalpur in district Patna/Sripalpur, Bihar is flowing at 51.95m against the danger level of 50.60 m with Rising trend.

West Bengal

➤ River Ganga at Farakka in district Murshidabad/Farakka, West Bengal is flowing at 22.32m against the danger level of 22.25 m with Falling trend.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 19th Aug, 2012.</u>

- ❖ In Assam, 13 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 439 personnel (Kamrup-22, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-35, Dhubri-71, Karimganj -36, Sonitpur-72, Lakhimpur-35, Jorhat-28, Nagaon-32, Barpeta-32, Silchar-34) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In West Bengal, 04 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 112 personnel (Siliguri- 55, Mainaguri-28 and Jalpaiguri-29) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 96 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.

- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 116 personnel (Mujjafarpur-34, Supoul-33, Gopalganj-30, and Darbhanga-19) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
- ❖ In Uttrakhand 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 50 personnel deployed in UttarKashi, for rescue and relief operation.
