Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 22.08.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at most places over Himachal Pradesh, east Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha; at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, West Bengal & Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, west coast, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at a few places over Madhya Maharashtra, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside west Rajasthan, north Gujarat, north interior Karnataka and Tamilnadu where weather remained mainly dry.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over western Himalayan region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Rajasthan, Indo Gangetic Plains central India, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states, west coast, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many a few places over Jharkhand and Odisha.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There are 03 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 22.08.2012.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

- 27 Teams consisting of 850 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –13, Andhra Pradesh–01, West Bengal-04, Maharashtra-03, Uttarakhand-01, Delhi-01 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over western Himalayan region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Rajasthan, Indo Gangetic Plains central India, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states, west coast, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many a few places over Jharkhand and Odisha.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

Weather Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Jammu division of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and east Rajasthan during next 48 hours.
- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh during next 48 hours and over Assam & Meghalaya during next 24 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rainfall would occur at many places over west Himalayan region, west coast, east and northeast India.
- Rainfall would occur at a few places over northern plains.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 22nd August, 2012, 03 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

Assam

- River Jiabharali at Jiabharali (NTX) in district Sonitpur/Balipara, Assam is flowing at 77.31 m against the danger level of 77.00 m with Rising trend.

Bihar

- River PunPun at Sripalpur in district Patna/Sripalpur, Bihar is flowing at 51.46 m against the danger level of 50.60 m with Falling trend.

East Uttar Pradesh

- River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge in district Barabanki/, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.35 m against the danger level of 106.07 m with Rising trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 22nd Aug, 2012.

- ❖ In Assam, 13 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 437 personnel (Kamrup-22, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-35, Dhubri-71, Karimganj -36, Sonitpur-71, Lakhimpur-35, Jorhat-28, Nagaon-32, Barpeta-31, Silchar-34) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In West Bengal, 04 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 115 personnel (Siliguri- 59, Mainaguri-30 and Jalpaiguri-26) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.

- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 95 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 116 personnel (Mujjafarpur-34, Supoul-33, Gopalganj-30, and Darbhanga-19) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
- ❖ In Delhi 01 team consisting of 22 personnel is deployed in connection with monsoon session of Parliament House.
- ❖ In Utrakhand 01 team of 8th Bn NDRF consisting of 50 personnel deployed in UttarKashi, for rescue and relief operation.
