Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**
SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 31.07.2012

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, west Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan & Goa, Orissa, Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand; at a few places over Marathwada and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside west Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Telangana, south Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamilnadu and Lakshadweep where weather remained mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (3 cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Durg-12, Rajnandgaon-10, Gondia-8, Mahabaleshwar and Agra-6, each, Jamshedpur, Canning Seoni and Mandla-5 each and Dehradun, Gwalior, Baripada, Digha, Raipur and Champa-3 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over western Himalayan region, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan and Gujarat region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over central & east India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Punjab, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, north Andhra Pradesh and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over remaining parts of the country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There are 08 Moderate flood situation sites in the country as on **31.07.2012**.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

- 29 Teams consisting of 980 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam –14, Andhra Pradesh – 01, Jharkhand-01, North Bengal-04, Maharashtra-03, J&K-02 and Bihar-04.

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over western Himalayan region, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan and Gujarat region.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over central & east India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over west coast, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Punjab, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, north Andhra Pradesh and Lakshadweep.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over remaining parts of the country.

Weather Warning

- Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa and Orissa during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over western Himalayan region, Uttar Pradesh, west coast east and northeast India and at a few places over rest northwest India.
- Subdued rainfall would continue over south interior peninsular India.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated **31st July, 2012**, there are 08 Moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

Moderate Flood Site

Assam & Meghalaya

- River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in district Jorhat, Assam is flowing at 85.52 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with Rising trend.
- River Brahmaputra at Dhubri in District Dhubri, Assam is flowing at 28.88 m against the danger level of 28.62 m with Falling trend.
- River Burhidihing at Chenimari(Khowang) in District Dibrugarh/Khowang, Assam is flowing at 102.44 m against the danger level of 102.11 m with Falling trend.
- River Dikhow at Sivsagar in District Sivsagar, Assam is flowing at 93.45 m against the danger level of 92.40m with Rising trend.
- River Desang at Nanglamoraghat in District Sivasagar, Assam is flowing at 95.36 m against the danger level of 94.46 m with Falling trend.
- River Dhansiri(S) at Numaligarh in District Golaghat/Numalighat, Assam is flowing at 77.90m against the danger level of 77.42 m with Falling trend.

Bihar

- River Kosi at Basua in district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.95 m against the danger level of 47.75 m with Falling trend.

Uttar Pradesh

- River Ghaghra at Elgin bridge in distt-Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.08 m against the danger level of 106.07 m with Rising trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON **31st July, 2012.**

- ❖ In Assam, 14 teams of 1st & 2nd NDRF consisting of 487 personnel (Kamrup-23, Dhemaji-42, Sivasagar-34, Dhubri-66, Karimganj -35, Sonitpur-149, Jorhat-33, Nagaon-36, Barpeta-36, Silchar-33) deployed in connection with familiarization & community awareness programme, flood relief/rescue, distribution of relief materials to persons affected by communal violence training and emergency response.
- ❖ In North Bengal, 4 teams of 2nd Bn, NDRF consisting of 138 personnel (Mainaguri-35, Alipurdowar-34 & Siliguri- 69) deployed for flood rescue and relief operation.
- ❖ In Jharkhand, 01 team of 2nd Bn NDRF consisting of 34 personnel deployed at District Deoghar for FAMEX and Sawan Mela duty.

- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 105 personnel (Mumbai Sub urban-35, Mumbai-70) deployed for pre monsoon duty.
- ❖ In J&K, 02 teams of 7 BN NDRF consisting of 75 personnel (Pahalgam-28, Chandanwadi,-47) deployed for FAMEX & Amarnath Yatra duty and SAR ops.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 126 personnel (Mujjafarpur-37 Supoul- 35, Gopalganj-33, Dharbhanga-21) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
