Subject: SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2012: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 22.09.2012.

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many places over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya; at a few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha, north Chhattisgarh and east Madhya Pradesh and at one or two places over Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, west Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Konkan & Goa Madhya Maharashtra, north coastal Andhra Pradesh and Andaman & Nicobar Islands. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country. The rainfall (1 cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Cherrapunji-7, Wardha-5, Tuni-4, Bir, Chandrapur, North Lakhimpur and Betul-3 each, Passighat, Hut-bay and Napapattinam-2 each and Bhagalpur, Mandla, Seoni, Amraoti, Washim and Dibrugarh -1 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places over Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh during next 24 hours and at many places thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Sub-Himalayan, West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, east Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, north Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra and Konkan & Goa during next 48 hours and decrease thereafter.
