RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rainfall occurred at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at a few places over south coastal Andhra Pradesh and Mizoram and at one or two places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Gangetic West Bengal, rest northeastern States, Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Odisha, rest Andhra Pradesh and TAmilnadu. Weather remained mainly dry over rest parts of the country. The chief amounts of rainfall (2 cm and above) recorded at 1730 hours IST of yesterday were: Betul-5 and Tirupathi, Chennai and Shillong-2 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu & Puducherry and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

<u>DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 27th Sept, 2012.</u>

- ❖ In Assam, 08 teams of 1st NDRF consisting of 234 personnel (Kamrup(02 teams)-49, Dhemaji-35, Sonitpur(02 teams)-64, Tinsukia (03 teams)-86) deployed in connection with flood rescue and relief operations.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 01 team of 5th Bn NDRF consisting of 15 personnel in Guntur along with necessary equipments for emergency response and also imparting DM training to personnel of 10 Bn, NDRF.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, 03 teams of 5th Bn, NDRF consisting of 95 personnel in Mumbai deployed for monsoon duty.
- ❖ In Bihar 04 teams of 9th Bn NDRF consisting of 109 personnel (Mujjafarpur-30, Supoul- 30, Gopalganj-27 and Darbhanga-23) deployed for emergency response during monsoon season.
