31 Provinces Still Flooded, 19 Provinces Getting Better

November 4, 2010

The effect of low pressure area, moving over Southern, Central, Eastern part coupled with South East Monsoon has caused damage to 39 provinces, 384 district, 2,838 sub-district, 24,575 villages, 1,812,971 households and 5,992,712 persons. Recently, 19 provinces (Pichit, Petchabun, Rayong, Chanburi, Trad, Tak, Chonburi, Lamphun, Chaing Mai, Srakaew, Nakhonnayok, Khampangpetch, Phitsanulok, Nongbualampu, Prachinburi, Samutprakarn, Nakhonpathom, Uthaithani, and Buriram) are getting better. Whereas 20 provinces, 97 districts, 713 sub-districts, 5,374 villages, 546,712 households and 1,685,019 persons still suffers from flood. Those provinces include 1 province in Northern part (Nakornsawan); 9 in Northeastern part (Nakornratchasima, Chaiyaphum, Srisakes, Surin, Khonkaen, Kalasin, Mahasarakham, Roi Et and Ubonratchathani); 9 Central Provinces (Chainart, Singburi, Angthong, Suphanburi Pra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya, Lopburi, Saraburi, Nonburi and Pathumthani); and 1 Eastern Province (Chacheongsao). It is estimated that 4,104,313 rai of farmland (1,622,717 acres) and 110 casualties.

In addition, the Tropical Depression in the Gulf of Thailand, moving over the Southern part of Thailand, causes heavy rainfall and flooding in 11 provinces, 96 districts, 542 sub-districts, 3,671 villages, 196,304 households and 682,970 persons. Eleven provinces include Songkhla, Satun, Trang, Narathiwat, Yala, Pattani, Phattalung, Surattani, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Krabi and Chumporn) 12 casualties in 4 provinces (8 in Songkla, 1 in Satun, 1 in Surat Thani and 2 in Pattani).
