### > The 4th ADRC International Meeting in New Delhi, India

80 people from 22 countries, International Organizations and others participated

ADRC organized three annual meetings in Kobe, Japan. On January 22-23, 2002, the Government of India and ADRC co-organized the Fourth International Meeting in New Delhi, India. This was the first annual meeting outside Japan in order to begin giving exposure of the disaster reduction strategies to the participants of the Member Countries, 80 people from 22 Member Countries, UN and other International Organizations' disaster management experts participated in the Meeting.

In the Session of "Lesson Learned from Gujarat Earthquake", the Government of India, the Member Countries and related organizations re-recognized the importance of preparedness, awareness, training, and community participation in

strengthening the disaster management system. In addition, the Government of India reported that ADRC's network will further contribute to strengthen international cooperation in various fields of disaster reduction.

In the "Capacity building" and "Information sharing" Sessions, the importance of the Total Disaster Risk Management Approach was confirmed. Further cooperation for capacity building, suitable to the situation of each country is expected to be strengthened. To support this, the existing information sharing system of the ADRC is needed to develop further through using the latest available high technology like satellite technology and Internet. It was confirmed in the meeting that ADRC would continuously promote cooperation for disaster mitigation in the Asian region by using human and technical resources.

Following the ADRC Meeting, United Nations International Strategy for Disaster Reduction Asia Meeting was held at the same venue. ADRC is expected to be a focal point of United Nations International Strategy for Disaster Reduction activities in Asia, as well as an International Center. ADRC will strongly cooperate with the Member and Advisory Countries as well as UN agencies and international agencies in contributing towards preventing the excess damage due to the occurrences of disasters in the Region and toward mitigating their adverse impact.

#### Recent Natural Disasters in Asia

### □ Floods in Indonesia

Widespread floods triggered by days of heavy rain since Jan. 28 have caused heavy damages to the capital, Jakarta and other cities in Indonesia. As of Feb. 1, 33 people have been killed and almost 200,000 residents have been left homeless. Officials said between 15-20% of Jakarta were underwater on Jan. 30.
