Promoting Cooperation with Affiliated Institutions

The 2nd GLIDE Steering Committee Meeting

The 2nd GLIDE Steering Committee (SC) meeting took place on 8 December 2021. A total of 13 people from SC member organizations participated in the meeting to share views and discuss the progress being made on GLIDE system improvements.

Following the presentation of the GLIDE activity report for 2021, three subcommittees working on SOP, API, and Product Development reported on their plans and recommendations, triggering interactive and insightful discussions among participants.

Participation in International Conferences

ADRC Participates in APP-DRR Forum

ADRC participated in the Asia-Pacific Partnerships for Disaster Risk Reduction (APP-DRR) Forum, held virtually on 8-9 December 2021, to discuss the key priorities in and progress made on implementing the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction across the region. The discussions emphasized seizing new opportunities to make more progress through the new Asia Pacific Action Plan (2021-2024), the Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction, to be held 23-38 May 2022 in Bali, Indonesia; the Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (APMCDRR), to be held 19-22 September 2022 in Brisbane, Australia; and the Mid-Term Review of the Sendai Framework.



Statement by Mr Nakagawa, ADRC Executive Director

In his statement at the Forum, ADRC Executive Director NAKAGAWA Masaaki, proposed two points to advance an evidence-based approach for the mid-term review. One is to place more focus on data development in developing countries to address the ongoing challenge of a lack of disaster risk reduction data. The other is to better promote efforts to reduce disaster risk (before a disaster), in addition to conducting disaster response activities (after a disaster). Mr NAKAGAWA pointed out the need for risk-informed investment in structural and non-structural measures (e.g., development plans and land use plans) in the implementation of the Sendai Framework. Participation in the 16th Integrated Workshop

As an observer in the ESCAP/WMO Typhoon Committee, ADRC participated in the 16th Integrated Workshop (IWS) held online on 2-3 December 2021. The IWS is an annual event that gives members and observers of the Typhoon Committee (TC) an opportunity to review the activities and progress of the four TC working groups: Working Group on Meteorology (WGM); Working Group on Hydrology (WGH); Working Group on Disaster Risk Reduction (WGDRR); and Training and Research Coordination Group (TRCG). During the two-day event, the members of each working group discussed, in parallel, their priorities based on the TC's Draft Strategic Plan 2022-2026.

ADRC is a member of the WGDRR, and participated in discussions of the following priorities and key result areas (KRAs).
