Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction 2025 to be Held in Tokyo

As announced in the previous issue, the Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction 2025 (ACDR2025) will be held in Tokyo, Japan from 17 to 19 December 2025, hosted by the Cabinet Office of Japan. This year's theme is 'Forging Resilience Together: Toward a Sustainable Society Prepared for Mega-Disasters.'

Launching of the AADMER Work Programme 2026-2030

Started in January 2025, Asian Disaster Reduction Center (ADRC) has been supporting the ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management (ACDM) in developing the AADMER Work Programme 2026-2030 (AWP 2026-2030). The AWP 2026-2030 is the fourth iteration of a five-year strategic plan of ASEAN in implementing the mandate of ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER). The ten month development process includes technical work, interviews with ASEAN Member States, ASEAN Secretariat, and the AHA Centre, consultation workshops with the three ACDM working groups in February and March 2025, a consultation workshop with the ACDM and a consultation workshop with ASEAN Disaster Resilience Platform that included the participation of

ASEAN's 13 sectoral bodies in May 2025, and series of consultation workshops with ASEAN Dialogue Partners, including Japan, ASEAN Sectoral Dialogue Partners, ASEAN Development Partners, United Nations agencies, the Red Cross and Red Crescent movement, relevant regional organisations, multilateral banks, ASEAN entities, academia, AADMER Partnership Groups, civil society organisations, representatives of youth, women, and people with disabilities, and the private sector. It was then followed by series of consultation, drafting, and deliberation with the ACDM Task Force for the development of AWP 2026-2030 and ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management for their adoption.

After ten months of development, the AWP 2026-2030 was launched during the Welcome Ceremony of the 13th ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management and Related Meetings on 15 October 2025 in Phnom Penh Cambodia. The AWP 2026-2030 is now available publicly here (https://asean.org/book/aadmer-work-programme-2026-2030-2/) to guide ASEAN Member States and broader partners in realising a resilient ASEAN. The AWP 2026-2030 strives to bring the region closer to its vision as "a region of disaster-resilient nations, where disaster losses in lives, social, and environmental assets are substantially reduced through concerted national efforts, intensified regional and global cooperation and leadership, in pursuit of safer communities and sustainable resilience" through 5 Priority Programmes, its 15 Outcomes and 44 Outputs (including 13 cross-sectoral outputs). The five Priority Programmes are Risk Assessment, Monitoring, and Early Warning; Prevention and Mitigation; Preparedness and Response; Resilient Recovery; and Global Leadership.

The ADRC is not only facilitating the technical and collaborative development of AWP 2026-2030, but also development of strategic and creative communication products including artworks of the AWP 2026-2030 book, a launch video, and three sets of infographics. With this creative communication products development, the AWP 2026-2030 can be strategically reached out to relevant actors for a whole of-society collaboration in ASEAN resilience building. Following the launch of AWP 2026-2030, related work plans will be developed, including the ASEAN-Japan Work Plan on Disaster Management 2026-2030, ASEAN-UN Joint Strategic Plan of Action on Disaster Management, and others. The ADRC remains

committed to support the process and activities that will bring resilience to ASEAN Member States and Japan, through existing and future collaborations with ASEAN.

5th ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management (AMMDM) Plus Japan Meeting

ADRC participated in the 5th ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management (AMMDM) Plus Japan Meeting held on 16 October 2025 in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. During the meeting, various activities supported under the ASEAN-Japan Work Plan on Disaster Management 2021-2025 were reported.

The launch of the AWP 2026-2030, whose development was supported by the Japan-ASEAN Integration Fund (JAIF), was also announced. Participants shared their deep appreciation and positive evaluations for the development process of the AWP. In addition, a proposal was presented for developing the ASEAN-Japan Work Plan on Disaster Management 2026-2030 based on the newly launched AWP.

In addition, ADRC held several individual sidemeetings with its member countries to further strengthen cooperation.

The Fifth Global Expert Forum for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics

The Fifth Global Expert Forum for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics was organised online on 6 – 8 October 2025 by the United Nations in collaboration with regional partners, under the guidance of the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on Disaster-related Statistics (IAEG-DRS).

The 2025 Forum, hosted by the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) in collaboration with the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA), the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR), the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA), the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA), the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), and the



The Fifth Global Expert Forum for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics

United Kingdom Health Security Agency (UKHSA) aims to a) provide a platform to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and experiences between producers and users of disaster-related statistics, b) to increase awareness of, engagement in, and contributions to the work of the IAEG-DRS, especially the preparation of the Global Disaster-related Statistics Framework (G-DRSF), and c) to highlight key emerging areas for consideration in future efforts to improve the production and use of disaster-related statistics.

More than 100 representatives and experts from governments, academia, international organisations and NGOs, including ADRC, participated in the forum to discuss national and regional experiences, explore technical developments, and engage with G-DRSF.

The G-DRSF is expected to serve as a common statistical framework for disaster-related statistics to be proposed for consideration by the United Nations Statistical Commission. The draft framework is expected to undergo global consultation in late 2025 and be submitted to the Commission in early 2026.

The forum reaffirmed the global commitment to generating quality statistics that would contribute to public policies for disaster risk reduction, in line with the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
