

1. Asian Disaster Reduction Center

1-1. Background for the Establishment of the ADRC

The Asian Disaster Reduction Center (ADRC) opened offices in Kobe, Japan, on July 30, 1998. The major steps leading up to ADRC's creation are outlined as follows:

1) International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction (IDNDR)

At its 42nd General Assembly in December 1987, the United Nations designated the 90's as the International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction, and adopted a resolution aiming to sharply reduce damage caused by natural disasters around the world, particularly in developing countries, through joint international actions.

2) World Conference on Natural Disaster Reduction

In May 1994, the UN hosted the World Conference on Natural Disaster Reduction in Yokohama, Japan, to conduct an interim review of the 10-year initiative and propose a plan of action for the future. At the meeting, the "Yokohama Strategy for a Safer World", which pointed out the importance of international cooperation in regions that share common types of disasters and disaster reduction measures, was adopted. Disaster Reduction activities have since been promoted throughout the world based on this strategy.

3) Ministerial-level Asian Natural Disaster Reduction Conference

As the first step in regional level cooperation as per the Yokohama Strategy, the IDNDR Secretariat co-organized a meeting in Kobe in December, 1995 to formulate a policy on disaster reduction cooperation in Asia. Cabinet members involved in disaster reduction from 28 countries attended the meeting, who adopted the "Kobe Disaster Reduction Declaration" that contained ideas for promoting international cooperation in disasters including a proposal by Japan to launch studies into a possible creation of a system that could act as the disaster reduction coordinator in the Asian region.

4) Asian Natural Disaster Reduction Experts Meeting

The Government of Japan and the IDNDR Secretariat co-organized a meeting of experts in October 1996 to hash out how a central disaster reduction system, as written in the Kobe Disaster Reduction Declaration, might be created for the Asian region. Key personnel from disaster reduction bureaus of 30 countries attended. Parties agreed to study the creation of an "Asian Disaster Reduction Center" (tentative name) that would serve as secretariat for promoting activities of the conceptualized system.

5) Asian Disaster Reduction Cooperation Promotion Meeting

The Government of Japan and the IDNDR Secretariat co-organized a meeting in Tokyo in June 1997 to discuss specific activities of the conceptualized central disaster reduction system. Once again attended by key personnel from disaster reduction bureaus of 23 countries, the overall goal was to promote cooperation in disaster reduction efforts through concrete action. It was proposed at the meeting to create an office in Japan as the secretariat for the conceptualized system.

6) ADRC's Official Start

With momentum gathering on this series of meetings, the Japanese government discussed organization, budget and other aspects of the proposed office with other countries involved. Then, with the cooperation of Hyogo Prefecture, the Asian Disaster Reduction Center was officially established in Kobe on July 30, 1998.

1-2. Organization

At the onset, ADRC consisted of 22 member countries, 4 advisor countries and 1 observer organization. Later Armenia joined in August 2000 and Kyrgyz Republic in July 2002 bringing the number of member countries to 24. (For details, refer to Tables 2-1-1, 2-1-2, and 2-1-3).

1-3. Policy and Past Activities

1-3-1. Policy

ADRC operates as a center for sharing disaster reduction information in the Asian region. With this as the fundamental purpose, the following five activities were adopted at the past international meetings.

- Collection and dissemination of disaster reduction information
- Research into ways to promote cooperation in disaster reduction efforts
- Collection of information on emergency aid that differing countries can make available in a disaster situation
- Development of publications and programs to increase awareness and knowledge of disaster reduction
- Planning of educational and practical programs in disaster reduction

ADRC has pursued the following basic goals since its inception.

(1) Information Sharing

- ① ADRC provides the following information through its website.
 - Disaster information
 - Disaster reduction initiatives
 - Insights gained from disasters, education in disaster reduction and emergency drills
 - Disaster reduction technology
- ② ADRC holds regular meetings for personnel in charge of disaster reduction in member countries and works to build trust amongst members as a means for promoting international cooperation in disaster reduction efforts.
- ③ ADRC welcomes a limited number of researchers from member countries every year.

(2) Capacity Building in Member Countries

In order for member countries to build disaster reduction capacity, ADRC imparts awareness, education and training programs with member countries and international organizations.

(3) Cooperative Projects

ADRC takes part in joint projects with member countries targeted at building disaster reduction capacity.

1-3-2. Past Activities

It is of utmost importance to establish cooperative relationships with concerned nations and organizations. The purpose of this is to gather extensive and accurate data on disaster reduction and to disseminate it in the Asian region.

With this in mind, the center has actively attended relevant international conferences, visited various countries to conduct surveys, and welcomed organizations and individuals for tours and study programs. Since 1999, the center has held an ADRC international meeting every year for member countries, advisor countries and international organizations such as the UN. With cooperation of the Japanese Government and the United Nations Secretariat of the International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (ISDR), the Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction 2003 was held in Kobe in January 2003 (described later).

ADRC has also been enhancing its information services that were launched in the year of ADRC's inception to provide information on disasters around the world. It continues to build a

database of disaster reduction systems and other relevant information (described later) provided by member countries through past international meetings and makes the information available.

Through these activities, ADRC has gained recognition in international circles. In fact, ADRC was named one of the ten success stories at the IDNDR Programme Forum held as the conclusion to the 10-year international disaster reduction effort in Geneva, Switzerland, in July 1999.

Furthermore, in February 2000, ADRC launched a joint international project in cooperation with the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA), aimed at reinforcing disaster management in the Asian region by building a cooperative framework for disaster response. As part of this initiative, OCHA opened the Asian Disaster Response Unit within the offices of ADRC and assigned an advisor on disaster management to head up that office. The two organizations are sharing information and working closely together to promote activities.

In this fiscal year ADRC promoted human resource development projects to improve capacity to respond to disasters in the Asian region by jointly sponsoring with OCHA the Asian Meeting for "Total Disaster Risk Management (TDRM)" (held in Kobe, August, 2002) and the "UN Disaster Assessment and Coordination (UNDAC) Asia Induction Course" (March, 2003).

In August 2001 OCHA's Relief Web was brought to Japan with their operations for providing humanitarian and disaster relief information to the world over the Internet. Their activities to promote information sharing in the Asian-Pacific region have contributed to strengthening disaster management, emergency aid and humanitarian support.

At the Canberra Conference of the Global Disaster Information Network (GDIN) held in March 2001, ADRC made a proposal to introduce a standardized ID number for disasters worldwide (GLIDE), which is now being jointly developed and promoted with Relief Web and the Center for Research on the Epidemiology of Disasters of Louvain Catholic University (CRED) in Brussels, Belgium, as a means to effectively utilize disaster information archived around the world. ADRC continues to contribute to sharing disaster reduction information on a global basis.

Since 2002 when ADRC was appointed as an Inter-Agency Task Force member of the United Nations International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (ISDR), it has been actively supporting ISDR activities. ADRC attended the preparation meetings for the "World Summit on Sustainable Development" held in Cambodia (November, 2001) and Indonesia (May, 2002) and contributed to the effort to include an item concerning "disaster reduction" in the political declaration of the Johannesburg Summit.

At the "3rd World Water Forum (March, 2003)" ADRC jointly convened a session with the ISDR Secretariat under the theme "Living with Risk - towards effective disaster reduction," which illustrates close coordination with the ISDR Secretariat in contributions toward the implementation of the international disaster reduction strategy.

In addition to all of the above ADRC has accepted 15 guest researchers from member countries to provide knowledge and training on disaster reduction and cooperation with a view to enhance disaster reduction capacity of the Asian region.
