7 Securing a Good Understanding of Problems with Disaster Reduction Education and Trainings in the Asian Region

7-1 Background and Policy

We have developed a database on disaster reduction education and trainings after securing a good understanding of the needs for disaster reduction education/trainings in Asian countries and gathering information on disaster reduction education/training programs (disaster reduction training course) conducted in countries worldwide. We have now started publishing the information on our home page.

7-2 The Needs of Asian Countries concerning Disaster Reduction Education and Trainings

Described below are some of the needs concerning disaster reduction education and trainings in Asian countries as listed by member/advisory countries:

- 1. Regional cooperation in human resources development (India);
- 2. Development of experts in emergency search/rescue activities (Malaysia);
- 3. Development of experts in risk assessment/analysis, disaster relief communications and disaster reduction analysis (Mongolia);
- 4. Improvement of training in disaster reduction, early warning, emergency relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction (Nepal); and
- 5. Strengthening of training in disaster reduction technology (Philippines).

7-3 Database of Training Courses for Development of Disaster Reduction Experts

In fiscal 1998, we made inquiries to the United Nations and other international organizations, international disaster reduction organizations and governments concerning their disaster reduction experts' training courses. We built a database of available training courses (75 courses by 31 organizations), which is open to the public on our home page.

The database includes course name, organizer, specialized fields, duration, cost, curriculum, contact address, e-mail address, etc. Shown in Table 7-3-1 is an excerpt of the training course database.

7-4 Disaster Reduction Education and Trainings by the Center

The Center plans to develop disaster education and training programs and organize training courses. In fiscal 1998, we were able to organize only a few short-term education and training programs.

One of them is a one-month disaster reduction training course in an overseas technical trainee program set up by the Hyogo Prefectural Government. The trainee (Mr. Shen Fan Luan, Deputy Director, Observation &

Forecasting Center, Seismological Bureau of Hainan Province, P.R. China) was given training in the provision of disaster reduction information via the Internet. On returning home, he is expected to help build a disaster reduction information network with China via the Internet.

Shown in Table 7-4-1 and 7-4-2 are lists of training courses on international disaster reduction cooperation, the present status of disaster reduction measures in Japan and the disaster reduction information network, offered to disaster reduction staff and fire-fighting staff of local governments, overseas disaster reduction experts and the mass media.

7-5 Future Policy

In fiscal 1999, we will gather curricula and texts for each training course, while expanding our database of disaster reduction training courses. We also plan to start preparations for developing disaster reduction education and training programs and organizing training courses in the near future.
