## Q & A in ADRC Workshop at the BOSAI KOKUTAI

Question 1: Can we receive a certificate of participation?

**Answer 1**: In this workshop, ADRC does not provide certificates of participation.

**Question 2**: Foreign students are already educated about Japan culture and disaster preparedness before they come here. Also, foreign students have been familiarized to Japan and its environment once they arrived at their universities. So what else do you suggest?

**Answer 2**: Aside from giving orientation and familiarization of disaster risk management in Japan, students are also encouraged to participate in disaster drills, access and understand local hazard map, and awareness of disaster alerts among others.
